Jan 1918 at La Courtine; Base and Training Division, 1st Corps from 15 Jan to 4 Mar 1918; Depot Division, 1st Corps from 5 Mar to 12 Jul 1918, and also served as replacement division for the entire AEF from 11 April to early August 1918; 1st Depot Division, AEF from 13 July to 26 Dec 1918. On 15 Jan 1918 activities were transferred from La Courtine to the St. Aignan-Noyers area. (See 1st RD).

2nd DD: 83rd Division was so designated and concentrated in the Le Mans area on 30 Jul

1918; relieved by the American Embarkation Center 15-31 Dec 1918.

3rd DD: 76th Division was 3rd DD from 3 Aug to 7 Nov 1918, and located in the St.

Amand-Mont-Rond Area.

4th DD: 85th Division was so designated 28 Jul 1918 and moved to the area of Pouilly-

sur-Loire, Sancere, and Cosne; from 14 Aug to 29 Oct 1918 served as Depot Division, Intermediate Section, and from 30 Oct 1918 to 12 Jan 1919 was

Regional Replacement Depot, Second Army in Toul Area.

5th DD: 35th Division was so designated 14 Aug 1918 and moved to the Charost and

Mehun-sur-Yevre Area southwest of Bourges; relieved 19 Oct 1918.

6th DD: 40th Division was so designated 16 Aug 1918 and moved to La Guerche-sur-

l'Aubois and vicinity; 4 Nov 1918 moved to Revigny and vicinity; relieved 4 Dec

1918.
