

Marine Corps University Press (MCUP) is a federal government, military publisher. As such, our funding is designated by the Department of Defense through the U.S. government and supported by taxpayer dollars.

Open access refers to a publishing model for scholarly works that makes research information available to readers at no cost, as opposed to the traditional revenue-based model in which readers have access to scholarly information by paying a subscription or onetime fee. This concept applies to our journal program as well as our full-length monographs. An open access publishing model ensures that MCUP can make publishing decisions based on the quality of the content, the originality of the research and its resulting analysis, and the overall contribution to the existing literature—not on generating revenue.

Partnering with an open access publisher offers numerous benefits:

- Increased citation and usage: studies have shown that open access articles are viewed and cited more often than articles behind a paywall.
- Greater public engagement: content is available to those who cannot access subscription content, particularly at the primary and secondary levels of education.
- Increased interdisciplinary conversation: open access journals that cross multiple disciplines help researchers connect more easily and provide greater visibility of their research.
- Wider collaboration: open access publications and data enable researchers to carry out collaborative research on a global scale.
- Faster impact: researchers are empowered to build on existing research quickly.
