ENLISTED COLLEGE SEMINAR OVERVIEW

The Enlisted College Seminar classes are conducted 3 times per Academic Year (AY), with classes beginning each year in July, November, and March. Seminar classes (for example 1-23, 2-23, and 3-23). Each class consists of Sergeant School Seminars (SSSP), Career School Seminars (CSSP), and Advanced School Seminars (ASSP). All seminar programs are conducted in all 8 global regions on the same schedule and each class is 15 weeks.

Onsite Seminars are conducted after-hours one night a week for the duration of the school. Seminars typically start between 1700 and 1800 and run for 3 hours. Seminars are typically only held on Mon, Tue, Wed, or Thu evenings. Once accepted, students will be assigned to a seminar group and to an Adjunct Faculty. Approximately 5 days before the first evening seminar, the Adjunct Faculty will contact each student with information about their seminar assignment. Students will then attend evening seminars each week on the night and with the seminar group they were assigned.

Online Seminars are for Marines in exceptional situations that prevent them from attending the Resident school or an Onsite seminar. Acceptance is by exception only and the command must demonstrate that the Online seminar is the only option for the Marine to complete their PME requirement before they come into zone for promotion. GUEST OF HONOR

Sergeant Major Enrique Gato, Sergeant Major, Marine Medium Tiltrotor Squadron - 263 Marine Corps Air Station, New River, North Carolina

Sergeant Major Gato is a native of Miami, Florida. He enlisted in the Marine Corps on 13 September 1999 and attended recruit training at Marine Corps Recruit Depot Paris Island. After completing recruit training he reported for follow-on training at Marine Combat Training Battalion, School of Infantry, Camp Geiger and Supply School, Camp Johnson, North Carolina, where he received the MOS of 3043, Supply Administration and was promoted meritoriously to Private First Class.

From March 2000 to February 2001, Private First Class Gato served with 3d Marine Expeditionary Force Headquarters Group Supply, 3d Marine Expeditionary Force, Okinawa, Japan. He served as Fiscal clerk and Warehouse Clerk. During his tour, Private First Class Gato was promoted meritoriously to Lance Corporal and participated in exercise Ultra Focus Lens in South Korea.



In February 2001, Lance Corporal Gato was transferred to Headquarters & Service Battalion, Marine Corps Recruit Depot San Diego, California, where he served as Warehouse Non-Commissioned Officer In Charge. In December of 2001, Lance Corporal Gato was promoted meritoriously to the rank of Corporal.

Corporal Gato requested orders to Marine Security Guard School and graduated in September 2002 with the MOS 8156. From September 2002 to May 2005, Corporal Gato served with Marine Security Guard Detachment, US Embassy Yaoundé, Cameroun, and US Embassy Lisbon, Portugal, where he served as Watch Stander. In December of 2003, he was promoted to the rank of Sergeant.

In February of 2005, Sergeant Gato received orders to Inspector & Instructor Staff, Echo Co (-), Anti-Terrorism Battalion, Tallahassee, Florida, where he served as the Supply Chief, Communications Chief, Motor Transportation Chief and Color Sergeant. In April of 2007, he was promoted to the rank of Staff Sergeant.

From August 2007 to September 2010 Staff Sergeant Gato served with 24th Marine Expeditionary Unit, Camp Lejeune, North Carolina where he served as Supply Chief, Platoon Sergeant and Forward Command Element Staff Non-Commissioned Officer In Charge. He deployed to Kandahar, Afghanistan from February 2008 to November 2008 in support of Operation Enduring Freedom. Staff Sergeant Gato deployed from January 2010 through August 2010 with the USS Nassau Amphibious Strike Group participating in humanitarian operations in Port-o-Prince, Haiti.

In the summer of 2010, Staff Sergeant Gato requested orders to serve as a Faculty Advisor and was assigned to Staff Non-Commissioned Officers Academy, Camp Lejeune, North Carolina. During his tour, he served as Faulty Advisor for Career Course and Advance

Course. In February of 2011, he was promoted to the rank of Gunnery Sergeant.

In April of 2013, Gunnery Sergeant Gato transferred to Marine Corps Recruiting Station Salt Lake City, Utah where he served as Logistics Chief and Family Readiness Officer.

In March 2016 Gunnery Sergeant Gato was promoted to the rank of First Sergeant and received orders to 3d Battalion, 7th Marines. Serving as The Company First Sergeant for Company L and Headquarters & Service Company, he deployed in September 2016 and April 2018 in support of Operation Inherent Resolve with SPMAGTF CR CC 17.1 and 18.2.

From February 2019 to May 2020 First Sergeant Gato served with Infantry Training Battalion, School of Infantry- East, where he served as the First Sergeant for Company D & Headquarters & Instructor Company.

In May of 2020, First Sergeant Gato was promoted to Sergeant Major and received orders to Marine Light Attack Helicopter Squadron 167. During this time the squadron supported two WTI classes, multiple deployments for training and fleet support.

In July 2021, Sergeant Major Gato was transferred to Marine Medium Tiltrotor Squadron 263, where he is currently serving as the Squadron Sergeant Major.

Sergeant Major Gato has a bachelor's degree from American Military University. His personal awards include the Navy and Marine Corps Commendation Medal with three gold stars and the Navy and Marine Corps Achievement Medal with one gold star.

TO REGISTER

Students are required to fill out and return the below listed documents (in one email) to the Camp Lejeune regional office for enrollment into the Enlisted College Distance Education Program (ECDEP) to Mrs. Eve Worley at WorleyE@DavisDefense.com. The onsite and online seminar programs both require the NAVMC 11580 and certificate of completion of the prerequisite non-resident PME certificate. The Online seminar has an additional enrollment form requirement that will be provided after a brief screening over the phone. Partial packages will not be accepted. Once the package is approved, the student will receive an email requesting additional information to finalize their enrollment.

- a. The current version of the Command Screening Checklist NAVMC 11580. This form must be signed by Battalion/Squadron level Commanding Officer and Senior Enlisted Advisor. The medical screening portion of the Command Screening Checklist is not required for the Seminar Program due to the fact that there are no physical requirements in the DEP. The checklist no longer requires a 30-day recertification of PFT/CFT/Height-Weight. Commands are responsible for ensuring their Marines are within Marine Corps standards. Marines assigned to BCP are not eligible to attend resident or seminar program courses either online or onsite.
- b. A copy of the associated Marine Net Course Completion Certificate (EPME5000-Sgt, EPME6000-SSgt, or EPME7000-GySgt).
- c. The email must include the Marine's personal email, military email, contact phone number, and full name in the body text. This is to facilitate contact for the final step of enrollment.
