CSCDEP Program Information Camp Lejeune Region for Academic Year 2023

<u>The Program</u>: The Command and Staff College Distance Education Program (CSCDEP) provides graduate level education and training in order to develop critical thinkers, innovative problem solvers, and ethical leaders who will serve as commanders and staff officers in Service, joint, interagency, and multinational organizations confronting complex and uncertain security environments. CSCDEP (8900) is an eight-course ILS (Intermediate Level School) JPME I program designed to be completed over two academic years. Courses are designed to be taken sequentially as each course builds on the knowledge gained in preceding courses.

The CSCDEP consists of the following courses:

First Year Studies (CSCI)

8901, Theory and Nature of War 8902, National and International Security Studies 8904, Joint Operations 8903, Operational Art Second Year Studies (CSCII)

8905, Small Wars
8906, MAGTF Expeditionary Operations
8907, FMF & Naval Expeditionary Operations
8908, Operation Planning (and Final Exercise)

Enrollment Requirements/Eligibility:

- Marine Corps Majors, including LDOs, and selectees, and CWO-4 and selectees <u>will</u> enroll in the ONSITE seminars. Marine Corps Majors, including LDOs, and selectees, and CWO-4 and selectees <u>may</u> enroll in an ONLINE seminar if/when they are geographically located where no ONSITE seminar is available.
- 2. Sister Service Majors/0-4 & above & international field grade officers are encouraged to enroll in the onsite seminars.
- 3. Government civilians GS-13 equivalent and above are eligible for online or onsite seminars.
- 4. Marine Corps Captains who have three years' time in grade and CWO-3s, who have two years' time in grade and completed EWSDEP may enroll in CSCDEP. Captains and CWO3s who meet the enrollment criteria are required to enroll in the ON SITE seminars unless there are compelling circumstances that prevent them from enrolling in an ONSITE seminar.

The Enrollment Process:

- All <u>new</u> students must first enroll in the CSCDEP (8900ZZ0000) via MarineNet and select the CAMP LEJEUNE REGION. MarineNet open enrollment will begin on 1 July 2022.
- Your CSCDEP MarineNet enrollment request will be automatically forwarded to the Camp Lejeune regional office for processing. IMPORTANT: Please make sure both your primary and secondary email address listed in MarineNet are correct as incorrect listings could delay processing and/or seminar enrollment. Enrollments requiring a waiver will first require approval by the Registrar at the College of Distance Education and Training (CDET) Quantico.
- Students will need to create a MarineNet Moodle account if they do not have one already.
- Approximately 10 days prior to the start of the fall seminars, all students will be contacted with their seminar information. Fall seminars will begin in September 2022.
- <u>RETURNING STUDENTS</u> Students who have already completed portions of the CSCDEP must contact the regional office no earlier than 1 July 2022 to enroll in the remaining courses required for CSC completion. Seminar assignments are made on a first come-first served basis.

Seminars: Course are completed in either an ONLINE or ONSITE seminar. No independent study or weekend options. ONSITE students will meet with their assigned seminar on site <u>once per week</u> for approximately three hours.
