All students must bring serviceable/proper fitting Green on Green w/white socks and PT shoes for Initial Ht/Wt and Woodland MCCUU to change into after Check-ins.

  - Academy Briefs begin at 1100, if you are not Checked in/ registered you will be subject to the probability of not being enrolled.

### **Important Information for Students**

#### **Personal Time Management**

### **Director's Guidance**

You are participating in a professional military environment that demands the highest levels of discipline, appearance, and conduct. You are expected to carry yourselves with pride and purpose, fully understanding the responsibility that comes with the title of Noncommissioned Officer.
