Essay Prompt:

What are the most important qualities of an enlisted leader, and how have you seen them demonstrated—or had to develop them yourself—during your time as a Marine?

Who Can Submit:

All active-duty, Reserve, and veteran enlisted Marines, from Private to Sergeant Major.

Essay Requirements:

- Length: 750–1,200 words
- Original, unpublished work
- Clear, focused reflection on leadership traits, experiences, or lessons learned
- Submitted in a .docx file; properly formatted footnotes accepted
- Include your full name, rank, and mailing address in the body of the email
