INFORMATION PAPER

Subj: MARINE CORPS COUNTERNARCOTICS UPDATE

1. Background. The Assistant Commandant created a Counter-Drug Working Group (CDWG) in March of 1989 to prepare a "think piece" on the future role of the Marine Corps in support of the then unpublished National Drug Strategy. The current and contemplated future counternarcotics initiatives outlined in this paper represent initiatives addressed in the "think piece." In August 1989, a comprehensive counternarcotics update or "newsletter" was sent to all major USMC field commands, bases and stations. The intent was to focus our commanders' efforts on the war on drugs, bring them on line with regard to current information, and advise them what initiatives the Marine Corps is pursuing.

2. Department of Defense, Law Enforcement Agency, and Non-DoD Agency Support

a. Department of Defense (DoD) Support

(1) A lieutenant colonel is currently serving as the ground plans officer on the staff of the DoD Coordinator for Drug Enforcement Policy and Support. A lieutenant colonel is assigned to the Counternarcotics Operations Division (CNOD) in the J-3 on the Joint Staff and is responsible for coordinating DoD support for Host Nations involved in combatting illicit drug production and trafficking.

(2) On 1 April 1990, DoD established Regional Logistic Support Centers at Miami, El Paso, Long Beach, and Buffalo. The Marine Corps has provided a lieutenant colonel to head the Buffalo regional office and one Marine Staff Noncommissioned Officer with a logistics background has been assigned to the Miami, El Paso, and Long Beach offices. These offices provide assistance to Law Enforcement Agencies (LEAs) in procuring DOD equipment and training to support their local counternarcotics efforts.

b. Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) Support

(1) The Marine Corps provides personnel and training support to the DEA. Currently there are four Marine Officers and two Staff Noncommissioned Officers assigned to the DEA. Additionally, the Marine Corps temporarily provided two officers to assist the DEA in the development of a campaign plan for Operation Snowcap (drug lab eradication operations) and validated the training program for SNOWCAP. The Marine Corps is currently providing a plans officer and an intelligence officer, on a temporary basis, to assist SNOWCAP in analyzing the scope of chemical diversion in South America and formulating a chemical interdiction/control campaign plan.

(2) Pre-deployment training for DEA agents is conducted at MCCDC, Quantico, VA. This training prepares them for their deployments to South America in support of

Operation SNOWCAP. This training is conducted on a quarterly basis.

(3) At the request of the Attorney General, the Marine Corps has identified 170 acres of land adjacent to the FBI Academy at MCCDC, Quantico, VA to expand the FBI Academy to accommodate DEA training.

c. Law Enforcement and Non-DoD Agency Support. The Marine Corps has assigned 18 officers and 8 enlisted personnel to fill counternarcotics billets with the following agencies: Office of National Drug Control Policy (ONDCP), US Coast Guard, US Customs Service, State Department, Immigration and Naturalization Service, and the US Attorney's Office in Washington, DC. These billets represent the Marine Corps' fair share of DoD's personnel support to LEAs and non-DoD Agencies.

3. Unified and Specified Commands' Counternarcotics Support

a. CINCLANT (JTF-4)

(1) Past Activities

(a) Aircraft Support. USMC aircraft (OV-10) from the Second Marine Aircraft Wing have supported JTF-4 by conducting maritime detection and monitoring missions along the Florida coast and in the Gulf of Mexico. On occasion, detachments of OV-10 aircraft have been temporarily deployed to Homestead, AFB and NAS Key West in Florida.

(b) Caribbean Radar Support. During 1st Qtr FY-90, the Fourth Marine Aircraft Wing provided detection and monitoring support at Georgetown on Great Exuma Island. The TPS-59 radar filled a gap until an aerostat was in place.

(c) Mobile Training Team (MTT) Support. During September 1989, an MTT was sent to the Bahamas to provide the Royal Bahamas Defense Force with tactical training to enhance their drug interdiction capabilities. A second Bahamian MTT deployed 14 Jun 90 for a period of 30 days.

(d) Expanding MAGTF Capabilities. In November 1989, SECDEF tasked CINCLANT to develop a plan for the deployment of a Caribbean Counternarcotics Task Force. CG FMFLANT has task organized a MAGTF and prepared selected units to support this Task Force, should it be activated.

(2) Current Activities

a. Aircraft Support. The Second Marine Aircraft Wing has continuously deployed an OV-10 detachment to NAS, Roosevelt Roads, Puerto Rico since 1 Jan 90 to conduct maritime detection and monitoring missions in the Atlantic and Caribbean.

b. Caribbean Radar Support. Second Marine Aircraft Wing provides detection and monitoring support to JTF-4 from the Turks and Caicos Islands in the Bahamas. Using a TPS-8 Air Force radar, these Marines have contributed to numerous U.S. Customs Service intercepts of drug-trafficking aircraft. This support has been continuous since 1986, when it then supported the Office of the Vice President's National Narcotics Border Interdiction System (NNBIS).

(3) Future Activities. Commencing 1 Sept 90, the radar support provided to the Turks and Caicos Islands in the Bahamas will cease. The Marines and the TPS-8 radar will be replaced by the Air Force utilizing a TPS-43 radar system. This replacement is part of the scheduled completion of the Caribbean Basin Radar Network (CBRN). JTF-4 has requested the movement of the OV-10 detachment from NAS, Roosevelt Roads to Georgetown in the Bahamas. This move is in the planning stages and a firm deployment date is not known.

b. CINCSO

(1) Past Activities

(a) Equipment Support for Colombia. The Marine Corps provided \$5.7 million dollars worth of equipment and ordnance as part of the President's authorization of \$65 million dollars, under section 506(A) of the Foreign Assistance Act, for military equipment to support Colombia's counternarcotics effort. Where possible, the majority of the Marine Corps support was earmarked to support the Colombian Marine Corps.

(b) MTT Support. The Colombian Marine Corps (COLMAR) have been given the primary mission of combatting the movement of illicit drugs on the Colombian rivers. As a result of this mission, the Colombian Commandant, Rear Admiral Serrano requested US Marine Corps training assistance in preparing his Marines for this new mission. The US Marine Corps developed three MTTs to assist the COLMAR in recruit/NCO training, ordnance repair, and riverine operations. The ordnance repair MTT was completed 30 May 90, the recruit training/NCO MTT was completed 1 Jun 90, and the riverine MTT was completed 21 Jul 90.

(c) Riverine Support. The Andean Implementation Plan (S) and CINCSO OPLAN 6300 (S) both task the Navy and Marine Corps to provide riverine support to specified South American country counternarcotics efforts. In those South American countries with their own Marine Corps, the mission to conduct riverine operations has been given to that country's Marine Corps. The sixty-five thousand miles of rivers in the Andean Ridge countries alone portray the scope of the problem requiring both Navy and Marine Corps riverine support. The Marine Corps has taken the following initiatives to enhance its riverine capability and provide the necessary support to CINCSO:

1. CG I MEF has developed the capability to deploy language trained

MTTs for riverine training in support of the counternarcotics effort in LATAM. One such MTT provided the just completed riverine MTT in Colombia.

2. The Commandant authorized CG MCRDAC to purchase seven River Assault Craft (RAC) for concept validation of the Marine Corps' enhanced riverine capability. These craft provide assault fire support, C3I, and limited logistic/medevac support to a riverine assault force. The craft were delivered to CG LFTCLANT in Little Creek, VA on 6 Aug 90. CG LFTCLANT will conduct training for the RAC platoon crews and provide a test directorate to conduct the concept validation as directed by CG MCRDAC and coordinated with CG FMFLANT. CG MCCDC is developing the riverine operational concept for the validation/evaluation of the RAC integrated into the enhanced riverine capability and CG FMFLANT is providing the personnel to man the RAC Platoon, coordinate crew training with CG LFTCLANT, and participate in the Field Users Evaluation (FUE).

(d) Deployments for Training (DFTs). In response to a request from CINCSO, Co A, 8th Engineer Support Battalion assisted in the construction of a radar site on the north coast of Honduras. The radar site will perform a drug interdiction mission as one of several sites monitoring air and sea traffic in the Caribbean Basin Radar Network (CBRN). Work commenced 16 May 90 and was completed 30 Jun 90.

(2) Current Activities

(a) II MEF is currently providing a representative on a USN/USMC survey team in Ecuador to assess requirements for a future riverine MTT.

(b) II MEF is currently providing a captain with logistics background as a member of a joint USA/USMC/USAF site survey team in Bolivia. This team will assess training requirements and conduct a follow-on MTT to train and assist the Bolivian Joint General Staff for Special Force for the Fight Against Narcotics Trafficking (SFFANT) in operations and logistics planning, training management and communications.

(c) II MEF is currently planning for the deployment of a Tactical Operations Center (TAOC) (-) to Colombia to provide air surveillance radar support. Dates and location of this deployment is classified.

(3) Future Activities. The deployment of additional riverine MTTs to support counternarcotics efforts in Peru, additional radar support, and the possible deployment of an OV-10 detachment are also being considered in the near future to support SOUTHCOM objectives.

c. CINCFOR (JTF-6)

(1) Past Activities. CINCFOR was assigned the mission of coordinating law

enforcement agencies support on the southwest border in an effort to stem the flow of illicit narcotics into the United States. At the CINC's request, the Marine Corps provided a Marine Liaison Officer to Forces Command at Ft. McPherson, GA to assist in their counternarcotics efforts. CINCFOR established JTF-6 at El Paso to carry out his mission. Nineteen billets for Marines have been established at JTF-6 in accordance with the approved Joint Manpower Plan. Two of these billets, Deputy Commander and Operations Officer have been filled since Nov 89. The remaining billets are being staffed during the summer of 1990. To provide urgent engineer support to the staff until a Marine Engineer Officer is permanently assigned, a Major from the SO/LIC Branch in MCCDC is currently TAD to JTF-6. JTF-6 was activated for operations on 2 January 1990 and has assumed OPCON of all units deployed for training and surveillance operations along the border.

(a) Southwest Border Training. Joint training with the Border Patrol on the border, now coordinated by JTF-6, was initiated by the Marine Corps in the El Paso, Tucson, Del Rio, and Laredo Border Patrol Sectors. The initial training was conducted by Marines of the I Marine Expeditionary Force (I MEF) and offered the unique opportunity to conduct small unit tactical training in scouting and patrolling, camouflage and concealment, land navigation/map reading, and the selection and manning of observations posts (OP's). The training also had the side benefit of assisting the Border Patrol in observing and reporting smuggler activity in certain areas of the border.

1. A Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the Marine Corps and the Immigration and Naturalization Service/ Border Patrol was developed to cover the initial operations. This MOU outlined the parameters of the joint training and surveillance operations concept and was signed by the Commissioner of INS and the Commandant on 11 October 89. The MOU has been superseded by the activation of JTF-6 and is no longer required to provide support along the southwest border.

2. A draft joint training/operations order has been developed which documents the agreed upon structure and procedures for the concept. This document has been used as the baseline for all JTF-6 training and operations.

3. The first deployment of Marines to the border occurred in late November 90 when a company (-) from 1st Reconnaissance Battalion teamed up with Border Patrol agents to occupy OPs in the Tucson and El Paso Sectors. The Marines were billeted/messed at Fort Bliss (El Paso) and Davis-Monthan AFB (Tucson). Marines did not engage in search, seizure, apprehension, or pursuit of observed drug smugglers during this training, but they did provide information to the Border Patrol which resulted in some arrests and the seizure of significant amounts of marijuana and cocaine.

4. Fourth Marine Division (USMCR) Marines, augmented by I MEF Surveillance, Reconnaissance, and Intelligence Group (SRIG) elements to include remotely piloted vehicles (RPVs), conducted similar training in the Laredo and Del Rio

Border Patrol Sectors from 29 Jan 90 to 2 Mar 90. Their efforts resulted in the arrest of three smugglers and the seizure of large amounts of marijuana.

5. Intelligence Support. CG I MEF assigned an intelligence officer, Captain Bryan Lavender, TAD to the Tucson Border Patrol Sector (11-22 Sep 89) and the El Paso Border Patrol Sector (10-20 Oct 89). He was sent to offer intelligence planning assistance and to aid the Sector headquarters in the formal collection, production and dissemination of tactical intelligence. Previously, there was no formal process for the fusion of the information generated from the individual Border Patrol contacts. LtCol Tom Sullivan USMCR was sent TAD to the Tucson Sector 25 March-8 April in a follow-up visit. LtCol Sullivan assisted the Border Patrol with the implementation of Capt Lavender's recommendations.

(2) Current Activities. Currently, Marines from the Marine Corps Air-Ground Combat Center in 29 Palms, CA are assisting the San Bernardino County Sheriff's Department (SBCSD) and Customs Service in the Morongo Valley area. The Marines are providing ground and air surveillance assistance in the vicinity of desert air strips in the Morongo basin area suspected of being used by drug smugglers. Any suspicious activity is reported directly to the SPCSD and the Customs Service for appropriate action.

(3) Future Activities

(a) I MEF will provide engineer personnel and equipment support at Lake Amistad near Del Rio, TX in support of the US Border Patrol. The engineers will improve a small arms firing range for use by LEAs for training, and lengthen four concrete boat ramps around the lake which will facilitate boat launches by Customs and Border Patrol in their drug interdiction efforts.

(b) I MEF will provide ground surveillance sensor support and man listening posts and observation posts in support of US Customs in two separate operations. Dates and locations of these surveillance operations are classified.

d. CINCPAC (JTF-5)

(1) Past Activities

(a) Aircraft Support. USMC aircraft (OV-10 and RF-4B) have been provided in support of JTF-5 and the U.S. Customs Service in their detection and monitoring missions.

(b) MAGTF Support. CG FMFPAC has provided MAGTF support to shipboard law enforcement operations along the coast of California. Named LEO MAGTFs, these operations conducted surveillance of the California coastline for suspected smuggler routes and activity. These operations are conducted aboard US

Navy ships and were in support of JTF-5.

(2) Current Activities. I MEB units are conducting CINCPAC's OPERATION WIPEOUT, a Hawaiian marijuana eradication effort. The following support is being provided:

- (a) Remote Battlefield Surveillance System (REMBASS) in suspected marijuana fields.
- (b) One air traffic control element.
- (c) One intelligence analyst and one liaison officer to DEA.
- (d) Two portable global positioning systems.

(3) Future Activities. Since many of the source countries in the Pacific theater are not accessible to US forces, the III MEF source country counternarcotics detection, monitoring and interdiction effort will focus on Thailand and the Philippines. MTT's will be provided to train the local military and law enforcement officials in counternarcotics missions to include riverine operations if required.

4. Demand-side Reduction Initiatives. The Marine Corps' internal drug abuse program is well known and has been highly successful in reducing the abuse of drugs within our ranks, but now the Corps is reaching beyond "taking care of its own" and is working with community leaders to assist them in their efforts in ridding their neighborhoods of the scourge of illicit drugs.

a. The Assistant Commandant has appointed the Assistant Deputy Chief of Staff for Manpower and Reserve Affairs, Reserve Affairs, to direct Marine Corps demand-side initiatives with a nation-wide focus which reaches beyond the Corps and into the community.

b. In the last year, Marines have been involved in community oriented drug prevention programs which served over 600,000 civilians. These programs include Boy/Girl/Cub Scouts, Brownies, church groups, elementary and high schools, MCJROTC, and prisons, etc. Marine Corps Substance Abuse Counselors are very much involved in the local community and are frequently called upon to give lectures on substance abuse.

c. In order to formalize the Marine Corps' demand-side program, a Marine Corps Order (5355.4) entitled "Marine Corps Community Drug Education and Assistance Program" (MCCDEAP) has been published. This order provides guidance to the field on ways in which the Marine Corps and the individual Marine can be of assistance to the local community and encourages them to become involved in these programs. In coordination with MCCDEAP, we are developing a program for latchkey children (children in self-care) which will focus on both civilian and military children in and around Marine Corps bases and installations. The purpose is to provide professional guidance and keep children occupied with a developmentally appropriate curriculum

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which will reduce the demand for illegal drugs.

d. The State of Maryland requested assistance in establishing a youth correctional program. The Department of Public Safety and Correctional Services requested assistance in preparing "drill instructors" for the initial phase. The request was approved by SECNAV and the Marine Corps Officer Candidate School commenced a 3 week orientation course for the 7 identified instructors on 29 Jan 90. The orientation course included organization, discipline, procedures, conduct of drill and physical training, instruction and practice on conducting inspections and establishing standards for clothing, personnel, and billeting areas, etc.; instruction on stress and harassment; and other applicable instruction and training. Assistance will be provided after this initial training of trainers to help the Department establish their own "train the trainers" course. Five of the original 7 Maryland Corrections Officers completed the training course and graduated on 21 Feb 90.

e. In response to a request from the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department, the Marine Corps Recruit Depot, San Diego Drill Instructor's School is conducting two one-week periods of instruction at the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department Pitchess Honor Rancho. The focus of this instruction is on teaching drill and ceremonies, team and individual motivation, leadership and self-discipline. The training will prepare Sheriff's deputies in providing rehabilitation-oriented training to youthful offenders in Los Angeles County. The first training period was conducted 25-29 Jun 90 and the second training period will be conducted 10-14 Sept 90.

f. Currently the Marine Corps staffs 80 MCJROTC units at high schools throughout the Nation. We are currently pursuing the establishment of an additional 23 units for a total of 103. It is planned to put these additional units at high schools in inner cities, such as Washington, DC. The benefits provided by establishing positive role models in these schools could have a deterrent effect on the use of drugs by our high school students.

g. On 3 Jan 90, Mr. Sterling Tucker, Director, Drug Control Policy for the District of Columbia, visited the Commandant to solicit Marine Corps support for the District's "NOT ON MY BLOCK" program. The program is designed to recapture the District's neighborhoods from the drug dealers. In order to accomplish this goal, the program will rely heavily on citizen volunteers, as well as religious, civic, and business groups participation. Some aspects of the program include neighborhood watch and cleanup activities, youth education and recreation activities, public relations campaign, and additional police assistance to eliminate the drug dealers. Mr. Tucker requested that the Marine Corps review the program and provide planning assistance to his strategy teams for program implementation. The Marine Corps agreed to review the program and has provided planning assistance as necessary.

h. Commencing in Oct 90, the Officer Candidate School at Quantico, VA will offer two 3 week rehabilitation-oriented training courses per year for state and local

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corrections officers. These courses will be modeled after the previously conducted training for the Maryland State Corrections Officers. One course will be offered in Oct 90 and the second course will be offered in Apr 91.

5. The Marine Corps has set the pace in the Department of Defense in the counternarcotics effort and continues to be aggressive in assisting the President in reaching his goal of a drug-free America. The Commandant has recognized that this is a goal which we must attain, and is insisting that Marines of all ranks and in all positions in the chain of command get involved in the counternarcotics effort.

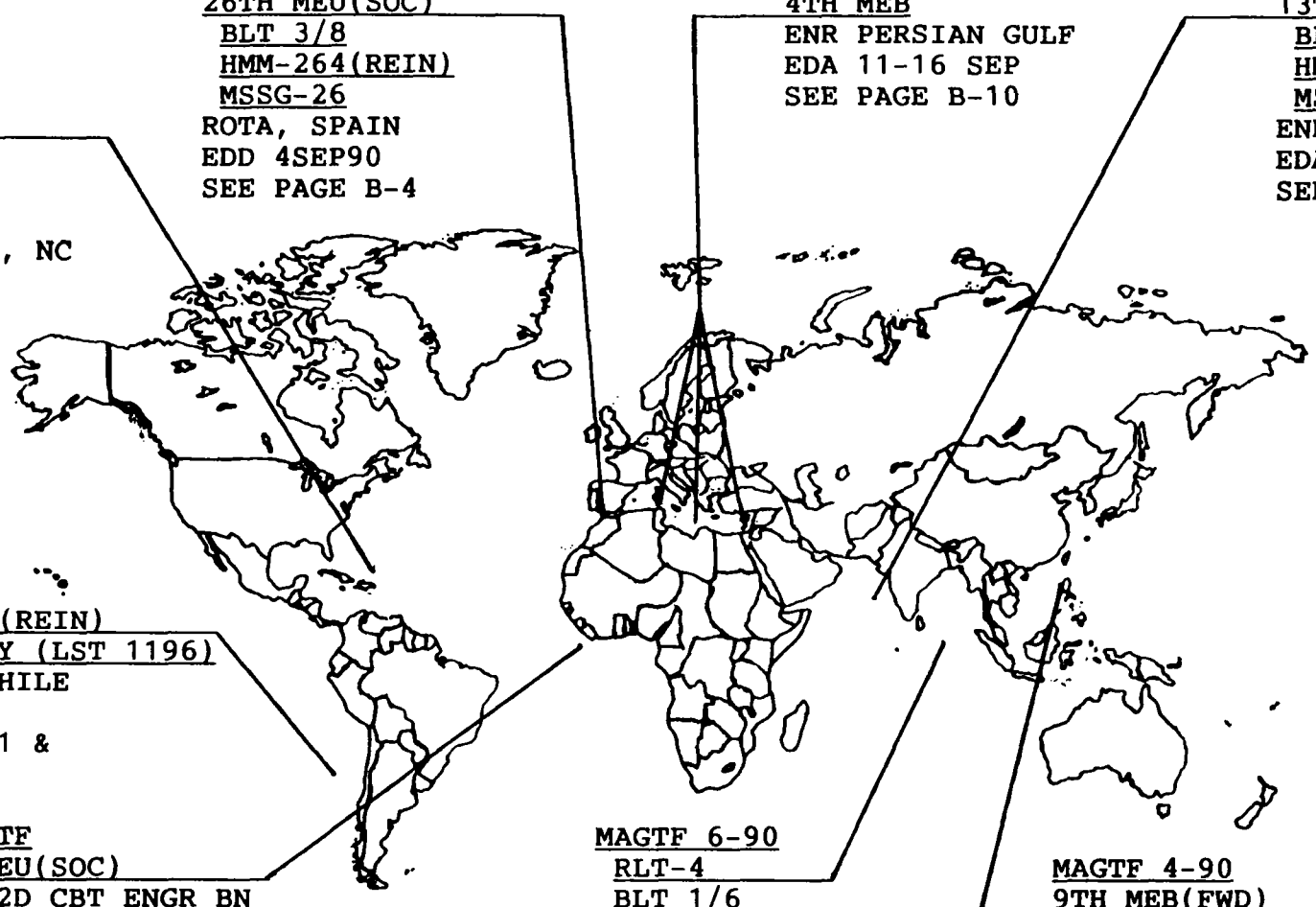

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INFORMATION PAPER

Subj: MARINE CORPS COUNTERNARCOTICS UPDATE

1. Background. The Assistant Commandant created a Counter-Drug Working Group (CDWG) in March of 1989 to prepare a "think piece" on the future role of the Marine Corps in support of the then unpublished National Drug Strategy. The current and contemplated future counternarcotics initiatives outlined in this paper represent initiatives addressed in the "think piece." In August 1989, a comprehensive counternarcotics update or "newsletter" was sent to all major USMC field commands, bases and stations. The intent was to focus our commanders' efforts on the war on drugs, bring them on line with regard to current information, and advise them what initiatives the Marine Corps is pursuing.

2. Department of Defense, Law Enforcement Agency, and Non-DoD Agency Support

a. Department of Defense (DoD) Support

(1) A lieutenant colonel is currently serving as the ground plans officer on the staff of the DoD Coordinator for Drug Enforcement Policy and Support. A lieutenant colonel is assigned to the Counternarcotics Operations Division (CNOD) in the J-3 on the Joint Staff and is responsible for coordinating DoD support for Host Nations involved in combatting illicit drug production and trafficking.

(2) On 1 April 1990, DoD established Regional Logistic Support Centers at Miami, El Paso, Long Beach, and Buffalo. The Marine Corps has provided a lieutenant colonel to head the Buffalo regional office and one Marine Staff Noncommissioned Officer with a logistics background has been assigned to the Miami, El Paso, and Long Beach offices. These offices provide assistance to Law Enforcement Agencies (LEAs) in procuring DOD equipment and training to support their local counternarcotics efforts.

b. Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) Support

(1) The Marine Corps provides personnel and training support to the DEA. Currently there are four Marine Officers and two Staff Noncommissioned Officers assigned to the DEA. Additionally, the Marine Corps temporarily provided two officers to assist the DEA in the development of a campaign plan for Operation Snowcap (drug lab eradication operations) and validated the training program for SNOWCAP. The Marine Corps is currently providing a plans officer and an intelligence officer, on a temporary basis, to assist SNOWCAP in analyzing the scope of chemical diversion in South America and formulating a chemical interdiction/control campaign plan.

(2) Pre-deployment training for DEA agents is conducted at MCCDC, Quantico, VA. This training prepares them for their deployments to South America in support of

Operation SNOWCAP. This training is conducted on a quarterly basis.

(3) At the request of the Attorney General, the Marine Corps has identified 170 acres of land adjacent to the FBI Academy at MCCDC, Quantico, VA to expand the FBI Academy to accommodate DEA training.

c. Law Enforcement and Non-DoD Agency Support. The Marine Corps has assigned 18 officers and 8 enlisted personnel to fill counternarcotics billets with the following agencies: Office of National Drug Control Policy (ONDCP), US Coast Guard, US Customs Service, State Department, Immigration and Naturalization Service, and the US Attorney's Office in Washington, DC. These billets represent the Marine Corps' fair share of DoD's personnel support to LEAs and non-DoD Agencies.

3. Unified and Specified Commands' Counternarcotics Support

a. CINCLANT (JTF-4)

(1) Past Activities

(a) Aircraft Support. USMC aircraft (OV-10) from the Second Marine Aircraft Wing have supported JTF-4 by conducting maritime detection and monitoring missions along the Florida coast and in the Gulf of Mexico. On occasion, detachments of OV-10 aircraft have been temporarily deployed to Homestead, AFB and NAS Key West in Florida.

(b) Caribbean Radar Support. During 1st Qtr FY-90, the Fourth Marine Aircraft Wing provided detection and monitoring support at Georgetown on Great Exuma Island. The TPS-59 radar filled a gap until an aerostat was in place.

(c) Mobile Training Team (MTT) Support. During September 1989, an MTT was sent to the Bahamas to provide the Royal Bahamas Defense Force with tactical training to enhance their drug interdiction capabilities. A second Bahamian MTT deployed 14 Jun 90 for a period of 30 days.

(d) Expanding MAGTF Capabilities. In November 1989, SECDEF tasked CINCLANT to develop a plan for the deployment of a Caribbean Counternarcotics Task Force. CG FMFLANT has task organized a MAGTF and prepared selected units to support this Task Force, should it be activated.

(2) Current Activities

a. Aircraft Support. The Second Marine Aircraft Wing has continuously deployed an OV-10 detachment to NAS, Roosevelt Roads, Puerto Rico since 1 Jan 90 to conduct maritime detection and monitoring missions in the Atlantic and Caribbean.

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b. Caribbean Radar Support. Second Marine Aircraft Wing provides detection and monitoring support to JTF-4 from the Turks and Caicos Islands in the Bahamas. Using a TPS-8 Air Force radar, these Marines have contributed to numerous U.S. Customs Service intercepts of drug-trafficking aircraft. This support has been continuous since 1986, when it then supported the Office of the Vice President's National Narcotics Border Interdiction System (NNBIS).

(3) Future Activities. Commencing 1 Sept 90, the radar support provided to the Turks and Caicos Islands in the Bahamas will cease. The Marines and the TPS-8 radar will be replaced by the Air Force utilizing a TPS-43 radar system. This replacement is part of the scheduled completion of the Caribbean Basin Radar Network (CBRN). JTF-4 has requested the movement of the OV-10 detachment from NAS, Roosevelt Roads to Georgetown in the Bahamas. This move is in the planning stages and a firm deployment date is not known.

b. CINCSO

(1) Past Activities

(a) Equipment Support for Colombia. The Marine Corps provided \$5.7 million dollars worth of equipment and ordnance as part of the President's authorization of \$65 million dollars, under section 506(A) of the Foreign Assistance Act, for military equipment to support Colombia's counternarcotics effort. Where possible, the majority of the Marine Corps support was earmarked to support the Colombian Marine Corps.

(b) MTT Support. The Colombian Marine Corps (COLMAR) have been given the primary mission of combatting the movement of illicit drugs on the Colombian rivers. As a result of this mission, the Colombian Commandant, Rear Admiral Serrano requested US Marine Corps training assistance in preparing his Marines for this new mission. The US Marine Corps developed three MTTs to assist the COLMAR in recruit/NCO training, ordnance repair, and riverine operations. The ordnance repair MTT was completed 30 May 90, the recruit training/NCO MTT was completed 1 Jun 90, and the riverine MTT was completed 21 Jul 90.

(c) Riverine Support. The Andean Implementation Plan (S) and CINCSO OPLAN 6300 (S) both task the Navy and Marine Corps to provide riverine support to specified South American country counternarcotics efforts. In those South American countries with their own Marine Corps, the mission to conduct riverine operations has been given to that country's Marine Corps. The sixty-five thousand miles of rivers in the Andean Ridge countries alone portray the scope of the problem requiring both Navy and Marine Corps riverine support. The Marine Corps has taken the following initiatives to enhance its riverine capability and provide the necessary support to CINCSO:

1. CG I MEF has developed the capability to deploy language trained

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MTTs for riverine training in support of the counternarcotics effort in LATAM. One such MTT provided the just completed riverine MTT in Colombia.

2. The Commandant authorized CG MCRDAC to purchase seven River Assault Craft (RAC) for concept validation of the Marine Corps' enhanced riverine capability. These craft provide assault fire support, C3I, and limited logistic/medevac support to a riverine assault force. The craft were delivered to CG LFTCLANT in Little Creek, VA on 6 Aug 90. CG LFTCLANT will conduct training for the RAC platoon crews and provide a test directorate to conduct the concept validation as directed by CG MCRDAC and coordinated with CG FMFLANT. CG MCCDC is developing the riverine operational concept for the validation/evaluation of the RAC integrated into the enhanced riverine capability and CG FMFLANT is providing the personnel to man the RAC Platoon, coordinate crew training with CG LFTCLANT, and participate in the Field Users Evaluation (FUE).

(d) Deployments for Training (DFTs). In response to a request from CINCSO, Co A, 8th Engineer Support Battalion assisted in the construction of a radar site on the north coast of Honduras. The radar site will perform a drug interdiction mission as one of several sites monitoring air and sea traffic in the Caribbean Basin Radar Network (CBRN). Work commenced 16 May 90 and was completed 30 Jun 90.

(2) Current Activities

(a) II MEF is currently providing a representative on a USN/USMC survey team in Ecuador to assess requirements for a future riverine MTT.

(b) II MEF is currently providing a captain with logistics background as a member of a joint USA/USMC/USAF site survey team in Bolivia. This team will assess training requirements and conduct a follow-on MTT to train and assist the Bolivian Joint General Staff for Special Force for the Fight Against Narcotics Trafficking (SFFANT) in operations and logistics planning, training management and communications.

(c) II MEF is currently planning for the deployment of a Tactical Operations Center (TAOC) (-) to Colombia to provide air surveillance radar support. Dates and location of this deployment is classified.

(3) Future Activities. The deployment of additional riverine MTTs to support counternarcotics efforts in Peru, additional radar support, and the possible deployment of an OV-10 detachment are also being considered in the near future to support SOUTHCOM objectives.

c. CINCFOR (JTF-6)

(1) Past Activities. CINCFOR was assigned the mission of coordinating law

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enforcement agencies support on the southwest border in an effort to stem the flow of illicit narcotics into the United States. At the CINC's request, the Marine Corps provided a Marine Liaison Officer to Forces Command at Ft. McPherson, GA to assist in their counternarcotics efforts. CINCFOR established JTF-6 at El Paso to carry out his mission. Nineteen billets for Marines have been established at JTF-6 in accordance with the approved Joint Manpower Plan. Two of these billets, Deputy Commander and Operations Officer have been filled since Nov 89. The remaining billets are being staffed during the summer of 1990. To provide urgent engineer support to the staff until a Marine Engineer Officer is permanently assigned, a Major from the SO/LIC Branch in MCCDC is currently TAD to JTF-6. JTF-6 was activated for operations on 2 January 1990 and has assumed OPCON of all units deployed for training and surveillance operations along the border.

(a) Southwest Border Training. Joint training with the Border Patrol on the border, now coordinated by JTF-6, was initiated by the Marine Corps in the El Paso, Tucson, Del Rio, and Laredo Border Patrol Sectors. The initial training was conducted by Marines of the I Marine Expeditionary Force (I MEF) and offered the unique opportunity to conduct small unit tactical training in scouting and patrolling, camouflage and concealment, land navigation/map reading, and the selection and manning of observations posts (OP's). The training also had the side benefit of assisting the Border Patrol in observing and reporting smuggler activity in certain areas of the border.

1. A Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the Marine Corps and the Immigration and Naturalization Service/ Border Patrol was developed to cover the initial operations. This MOU outlined the parameters of the joint training and surveillance operations concept and was signed by the Commissioner of INS and the Commandant on 11 October 89. The MOU has been superseded by the activation of JTF-6 and is no longer required to provide support along the southwest border.

2. A draft joint training/operations order has been developed which documents the agreed upon structure and procedures for the concept. This document has been used as the baseline for all JTF-6 training and operations.

3. The first deployment of Marines to the border occurred in late November 90 when a company (-) from 1st Reconnaissance Battalion teamed up with Border Patrol agents to occupy OPs in the Tucson and El Paso Sectors. The Marines were billeted/messed at Fort Bliss (El Paso) and Davis-Monthan AFB (Tucson). Marines did not engage in search, seizure, apprehension, or pursuit of observed drug smugglers during this training, but they did provide information to the Border Patrol which resulted in some arrests and the seizure of significant amounts of marijuana and cocaine.

4. Fourth Marine Division (USMCR) Marines, augmented by I MEF Surveillance, Reconnaissance, and Intelligence Group (SRIG) elements to include remotely piloted vehicles (RPVs), conducted similar training in the Laredo and Del Rio

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Border Patrol Sectors from 29 Jan 90 to 2 Mar 90. Their efforts resulted in the arrest of three smugglers and the seizure of large amounts of marijuana.

5. Intelligence Support. CG I MEF assigned an intelligence officer, Captain Bryan Lavender, TAD to the Tucson Border Patrol Sector (11-22 Sep 89) and the El Paso Border Patrol Sector (10-20 Oct 89). He was sent to offer intelligence planning assistance and to aid the Sector headquarters in the formal collection, production and dissemination of tactical intelligence. Previously, there was no formal process for the fusion of the information generated from the individual Border Patrol contacts. LtCol Tom Sullivan USMCR was sent TAD to the Tucson Sector 25 March-8 April in a follow-up visit. LtCol Sullivan assisted the Border Patrol with the implementation of Capt Lavender's recommendations.

(2) Current Activities. Currently, Marines from the Marine Corps Air-Ground Combat Center in 29 Palms, CA are assisting the San Bernardino County Sheriff's Department (SBCSD) and Customs Service in the Morongo Valley area. The Marines are providing ground and air surveillance assistance in the vicinity of desert air strips in the Morongo basin area suspected of being used by drug smugglers. Any suspicious activity is reported directly to the SPCSD and the Customs Service for appropriate action.

(3) Future Activities

(a) I MEF will provide engineer personnel and equipment support at Lake Amistad near Del Rio, TX in support of the US Border Patrol. The engineers will improve a small arms firing range for use by LEAs for training, and lengthen four concrete boat ramps around the lake which will facilitate boat launches by Customs and Border Patrol in their drug interdiction efforts.

(b) I MEF will provide ground surveillance sensor support and man listening posts and observation posts in support of US Customs in two separate operations. Dates and locations of these surveillance operations are classified.

d. CINCPAC (JTF-5)

(1) Past Activities

(a) Aircraft Support. USMC aircraft (OV-10 and RF-4B) have been provided in support of JTF-5 and the U.S. Customs Service in their detection and monitoring missions.

(b) MAGTF Support. CG FMFPAC has provided MAGTF support to shipboard law enforcement operations along the coast of California. Named LEO MAGTFs, these operations conducted surveillance of the California coastline for suspected smuggler routes and activity. These operations are conducted aboard US

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Navy ships and were in support of JTF-5.

(2) Current Activities. I MEB units are conducting CINCPAC's OPERATION WIPEOUT, a Hawaiian marijuana eradication effort. The following support is being provided:

- (a) Remote Battlefield Surveillance System (REMBASS) in suspected marijuana fields.
- (b) One air traffic control element.
- (c) One intelligence analyst and one liaison officer to DEA.
- (d) Two portable global positioning systems.

(3) Future Activities. Since many of the source countries in the Pacific theater are not accessible to US forces, the III MEF source country counternarcotics detection, monitoring and interdiction effort will focus on Thailand and the Philippines. MTT's will be provided to train the local military and law enforcement officials in counternarcotics missions to include riverine operations if required.

4. Demand-side Reduction Initiatives. The Marine Corps' internal drug abuse program is well known and has been highly successful in reducing the abuse of drugs within our ranks, but now the Corps is reaching beyond "taking care of its own" and is working with community leaders to assist them in their efforts in ridding their neighborhoods of the scourge of illicit drugs.

a. The Assistant Commandant has appointed the Assistant Deputy Chief of Staff for Manpower and Reserve Affairs, Reserve Affairs, to direct Marine Corps demand-side initiatives with a nation-wide focus which reaches beyond the Corps and into the community.

b. In the last year, Marines have been involved in community oriented drug prevention programs which served over 600,000 civilians. These programs include Boy/Girl/Cub Scouts, Brownies, church groups, elementary and high schools, MCJROTC, and prisons, etc. Marine Corps Substance Abuse Counselors are very much involved in the local community and are frequently called upon to give lectures on substance abuse.

c. In order to formalize the Marine Corps' demand-side program, a Marine Corps Order (5355.4) entitled "Marine Corps Community Drug Education and Assistance Program" (MCCDEAP) has been published. This order provides guidance to the field on ways in which the Marine Corps and the individual Marine can be of assistance to the local community and encourages them to become involved in these programs. In coordination with MCCDEAP, we are developing a program for latchkey children (children in self-care) which will focus on both civilian and military children in and around Marine Corps bases and installations. The purpose is to provide professional guidance and keep children occupied with a developmentally appropriate curriculum

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which will reduce the demand for illegal drugs.

d. The State of Maryland requested assistance in establishing a youth correctional program. The Department of Public Safety and Correctional Services requested assistance in preparing "drill instructors" for the initial phase. The request was approved by SECNAV and the Marine Corps Officer Candidate School commenced a 3 week orientation course for the 7 identified instructors on 29 Jan 90. The orientation course included organization, discipline, procedures, conduct of drill and physical training, instruction and practice on conducting inspections and establishing standards for clothing, personnel, and billeting areas, etc.; instruction on stress and harassment; and other applicable instruction and training. Assistance will be provided after this initial training of trainers to help the Department establish their own "train the trainers" course. Five of the original 7 Maryland Corrections Officers completed the training course and graduated on 21 Feb 90.

e. In response to a request from the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department, the Marine Corps Recruit Depot, San Diego Drill Instructor's School is conducting two one-week periods of instruction at the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department Pitchess Honor Rancho. The focus of this instruction is on teaching drill and ceremonies, team and individual motivation, leadership and self-discipline. The training will prepare Sheriff's deputies in providing rehabilitation-oriented training to youthful offenders in Los Angeles County. The first training period was conducted 25-29 Jun 90 and the second training period will be conducted 10-14 Sept 90.

f. Currently the Marine Corps staffs 80 MCJROTC units at high schools throughout the Nation. We are currently pursuing the establishment of an additional 23 units for a total of 103. It is planned to put these additional units at high schools in inner cities, such as Washington, DC. The benefits provided by establishing positive role models in these schools could have a deterrent effect on the use of drugs by our high school students.

g. On 3 Jan 90, Mr. Sterling Tucker, Director, Drug Control Policy for the District of Columbia, visited the Commandant to solicit Marine Corps support for the District's "NOT ON MY BLOCK" program. The program is designed to recapture the District's neighborhoods from the drug dealers. In order to accomplish this goal, the program will rely heavily on citizen volunteers, as well as religious, civic, and business groups participation. Some aspects of the program include neighborhood watch and cleanup activities, youth education and recreation activities, public relations campaign, and additional police assistance to eliminate the drug dealers. Mr. Tucker requested that the Marine Corps review the program and provide planning assistance to his strategy teams for program implementation. The Marine Corps agreed to review the program and has provided planning assistance as necessary.

h. Commencing in Oct 90, the Officer Candidate School at Quantico, VA will offer two 3 week rehabilitation-oriented training courses per year for state and local

corrections officers. These courses will be modeled after the previously conducted training for the Maryland State Corrections Officers. One course will be offered in Oct 90 and the second course will be offered in Apr 91.

5. The Marine Corps has set the pace in the Department of Defense in the counternarcotics effort and continues to be aggressive in assisting the President in reaching his goal of a drug-free America. The Commandant has recognized that this is a goal which we must attain, and is insisting that Marines of all ranks and in all positions in the chain of command get involved in the counternarcotics effort.

INFORMATION PAPER

Subj: MARINE CORPS COUNTERNARCOTICS UPDATE

1. Background. The Assistant Commandant created a Counter-Drug Working Group (CDWG) in March of 1989 to prepare a "think piece" on the future role of the Marine Corps in support of the then unpublished National Drug Strategy. The current and contemplated future counternarcotics initiatives outlined in this paper represent initiatives addressed in the "think piece." In August, a comprehensive counternarcotics update or "newsletter" was sent to all major USMC field commands, bases and stations. The intent was to focus our commanders' efforts on the war on drugs, bring them on line with regard to current information, and advise them what initiatives the Marine Corps is pursuing.

2. Current Marine Corps Initiatives

a. Law Enforcement Agency (LEA) Support

(1) The Marine Corps provides personnel and training support to the LEA's. Currently there are four Marine Officers and two Staff Noncommissioned Officers assigned to the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA). Additionally, the Marine Corps temporarily provided two officers to assist the DEA in the development of a campaign plan for Operation Snowcap (drug lab eradication operations) and validated the training program for SNOWCAP. The Marine Corps is currently providing a plans officer and an intelligence officer, on a temporary basis, to assist SNOWCAP in analyzing the scope of chemical diversion in South America and formulating a chemical interdiction/control campaign plan.

(2) The Marine Corps provides pre-deployment training for DEA agents at MCCDC, Quantico, VA. This training prepares them for their deployments to South America in support of Operation SNOWCAP. This training is conducted on a quarterly basis.

b. Unified and Specified Commands' Counternarcotics Support. The Marine Corps provides officer and enlisted personnel to fill its share of the 237 DoD counternarcotics billets in the Unified and Specified Commands.

(1) CINCLANT (JTF-4)

(a) Aircraft Support. USMC aircraft (OV-10) support JTF-4 in their detection and monitoring missions in the Caribbean, the Gulf of Mexico, and areas off the coast of Florida. An OV-10 detachment from Second Marine Aircraft Wing has been continuously deployed to NAS, Roosevelt Roads, Puerto Rico since 1 Jan 90.

(b) Caribbean Radar Support

1. Fourth Marine Aircraft Wing provided detection and monitoring support at Georgetown on Great Exuma Island during 1st Qtr FY-90. The TPS-59 radar filled a gap until an aerostat was in place.

2. Second Marine Aircraft Wing provides detection and monitoring support to JTF-4 from the Turks and Caicos Islands in the Bahamas. Using a TPS-8 Air Force radar, these Marines have contributed to numerous U.S. Customs Service intercepts of drug-trafficking aircraft.

(c) MTT Support. A mobile training team was sent to the Bahamas to provide the Royal Bahamas Defense Force with tactical training to enhance their drug interdiction capabilities. A second Bahamian MTT deployed 14 Jun 90 for a period of 30 days.

(2) CINCSO

(a) Military Support to Colombia

1. Upon receipt of the JCS Execute Order, CMC issued an Execute Order to direct and coordinate USMC support to Colombia under section 506(A) of the Foreign Assistance Act.

2. In addition to providing equipment support, the Force Commanders were tasked to be prepared to provide Mobile Training Teams (MTTs) to support equipment integration. The Marine Corps has sent survey teams to Colombia in preparation for the deployment of MTT's for riverine operations, recruit training, and ordnance repair. The ordnance repair MTT was completed on 30 May 90 and the recruit training MTT was completed 1 Jun 90. The riverine operations MTT is currently being conducted and is tentatively scheduled to conclude on 10 Aug 90. These MTTs provided training for Colombian Marines and additional MTTs for riverine operations are contemplated for Peru and Bolivia.

(b) Riverine Doctrine. In anticipation of MTT requirements for riverine operations in LATAM, CG MCCDC is refining current riverine doctrine, and has developed an initial concept for employment of Marine units in riverine operations. CG I MEF has developed the capability to deploy language trained MTTs for riverine training in support of the counternarcotics effort in LATAM.

(c) Deployments for Training. In response to a request from USCINCSO, Co A, 8th Engineer Support Battalion assisted in the construction of a radar site on the north coast of Honduras. The radar site will perform a drug interdiction mission as one of several sites monitoring air and sea traffic in the Caribbean Basin Radar Network (CBRN). Work commenced 16 May 90 and is expected to be completed by the end of

Jun 90.

(3) CINCFOR

(a) CINCFOR was assigned the mission of coordinating law enforcement agencies support on the southwest border in an effort to stem the flow of illicit narcotics into the United States. General Powell requested, and CMC agreed, that the Marine Corps should provide a Marine Liaison Officer to Forces Command at Ft. McPherson, GA to assist in their counternarcotics efforts. LtCol Tony Hilliard reported 17 November 1989.

(b) CINCFOR established JTF-6 at El Paso to carry out his mission. Additionally, he requested a Marine Colonel to be the Deputy Commander of JTF-6 and a Marine Lieutenant Colonel to be the J-3 Operations Officer. Colonel Tom Carter is on board as the Deputy Commander and LtCol Bill Wood is the Operations Officer. Seventeen additional Marines will be assigned to JTF-6 in the near future in accordance with the approved Joint Manpower Plan. Currently, Major Don Todaro from the SO/LIC Branch in MCCDC is TAD to JTF-6 to provide engineer support to the staff until a Marine Engineer Officer is permanently assigned later this summer. JTF-6 was activated for operations on 2 January 1990 and has assumed OPCON of all units deployed for training and surveillance operations along the border.

(c) Southwest Border Training. The joint training with the Border Patrol on the border now coordinated by JTF-6 was initiated by the Marine Corps in the El Paso, Tucson, Del Rio, and Laredo Border Patrol Sectors. The initial training was conducted by Marines of the I Marine Expeditionary Force (I MEF). The concept offers the unique opportunity to conduct small unit tactical training in scouting and patrolling, camouflage and concealment, land navigation/map reading, and the selection and manning of observations posts (OP's). The training has the side benefit of assisting the Border Patrol in observing and reporting smuggler activity in certain areas of the border.

1. A Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the Marine Corps and the Immigration and Naturalization Service/ Border Patrol was developed to cover the initial operations. This MOU outlined the parameters of the joint training and surveillance operations concept and was signed by the Commissioner of INS and the Commandant on 11 October 89. The MOU has been superseded by the activation of JTF-6 and is no longer required to provide support along the southwest border.

2. A draft joint training/operations order has been developed which documents the agreed upon structure and procedures for the concept. This document is reviewed and refined as the training progresses.

3. The first deployment of Marines to the border occurred in late November when a company (-) from 1st Reconnaissance Battalion teamed up with Border Patrol agents to occupy OPs in the Tucson and El Paso Sectors. The Marines

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were billeted/messed at Fort Bliss (El Paso) and Davis-Monthan AFB (Tucson). Marines did not engage in search, seizure, apprehension, or pursuit of observed drug smugglers during this training, but they did provide information to the Border Patrol which resulted in some arrests and the seizure of significant amounts of marijuana and cocaine. Fourth Marine Division (USMCR) Marines, augmented by I MEF Surveillance, Reconnaissance, and Intelligence Group (SRIG) elements to include remotely piloted vehicles (RPVs), conducted similar training in the Laredo and Del Rio Border Patrol Sectors from 29 Jan 90 to 2 Mar 90. Their efforts resulted in the arrest of three smugglers and the seizure of large amounts of marijuana. Currently, Marines from the Marine Corps Air-Ground Combat Center in 29 Palms, CA are assisting the San Bernardino County Sheriff's Department (SBCSD) and Customs Service in the Morongo Valley area. The Marines are providing ground surveillance assistance in the vicinity of desert air strips in the Morongo basin area suspected of being used by drug smugglers. Any suspicious activity is reported directly to the SPCSD and the Customs Service for appropriate action. This training will continue through 31 Aug 90.

4. Intelligence Support. Captain Bryan Lavender from I MEF was assigned TAD to the Tucson Border Patrol Sector (11-22 Sep 89) and the El Paso Border Patrol Sector (10-20 Oct 89). He was sent to offer intelligence planning assistance and to aid the Sector headquarters in the formal collection, production and dissemination of tactical intelligence. Previously, there was no formal process for the fusion of the information generated from the individual Border Patrol contacts. LtCol Tom Sullivan was sent TAD to the Tucson Sector 25 March-8 April in a follow-up visit. LtCol Sullivan assisted the Border Patrol with the implementation of Capt Lavender's recommendations. Additionally, FORSCOM has requested the temporary assignment of a Marine Intelligence Officer to deploy with the Tactical Analysis Team (TAT) to Mexico City. This team will provide the Country Team intelligence interface between the Mexican government, American Embassy, FORSCOM and JTF-6 for the sharing of counternarcotics intelligence information. The duration of this assignment is expected to be 179 days.

(4) CINCPAC

(a) Aircraft Support. USMC aircraft (OV-10) are provided in support of JTF-5 and the U.S. Customs Service in their detection and monitoring missions.

(b) Source Country Support. Since many of the source countries in the Pacific theater are not accessible to U.S. forces, the III MEF source country counternarcotics detection, monitoring and interdiction effort will focus on Thailand and the Philippines. MTT's will be provided to train the local military and law enforcement officials in counternarcotics missions to include riverine operations if required. Marine Corps support in marijuana eradication in Hawaii is also being considered.

(c) Naval ships and aircraft will be used to detect, monitor and interdict drug-trafficking aircraft and vessels on the high seas.

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c. Support to Office of National Drug Control Policy (ONDCP)

(1) One Marine Officer is assigned to the ONDCP staff as an Operations Analyst and a Marine Staff Noncommissioned Officer is assigned as an Intelligence Analyst.

(2) On 1 April 1990, DoD established Regional Logistic Support Centers at Miami, El Paso, Long Beach, and Buffalo. The Marine Corps has provided a lieutenant colonel to head the Buffalo regional office and one Marine Staff Noncommissioned Officer with a logistics background has been assigned to the Miami, El Paso, and Long Beach offices. These offices will provide assistance to LEAs in procuring DOD equipment and training to support their local counternarcotics efforts.

d. Expanding MAGTF Capabilities. SECDEF tasked CINCLANT to develop a plan for the deployment of a Caribbean Counternarcotics Task Force. CG FMFLANT has developed a MAGTF concept to support this Task Force, when activated.

e. DEA Training Facility. At the request of the Attorney General, the Marine Corps has identified 170 acres of land adjacent to the FBI Academy at MCCDC, Quantico, VA to expand the FBI Academy to accommodate DEA training. Negotiations are taking place to effect the transfer of the land and to build a training center.

f. Demand-side Reduction Initiatives. The Marine Corps' internal drug abuse program is well known and has been highly successful in reducing the abuse of drugs within our ranks, but now the Corps is reaching beyond "taking care of its own" and is working with community leaders to assist them in their efforts in ridding their neighborhoods of the scourge of illicit drugs.

(1) The Assistant Commandant has appointed the Assistant Deputy Chief of Staff for Manpower and Reserve Affairs, Reserve Affairs, to direct Marine Corps demand-side initiatives with a nation-wide focus which reaches beyond the Corps and into the community.

(2) In the last year, Marines have been involved in community oriented drug prevention programs which served over 600,000 civilians. These programs include Boy/Girl/Cub Scouts, Brownies, church groups, elementary and high schools, MCJROTC, and prisons, etc. Marine Corps Substance Abuse Counselors are very much involved in the local community and are frequently called upon to give lectures on substance abuse.

(3) In order to formalize the Marine Corps' demand-side program, a Marine Corps Order (5355.4) entitled "Marine Corps Community Drug Education and Assistance Program" (MCCDEAP) has been published. This order provides guidance to the field on ways in which the Marine Corps and the individual Marine can be of

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assistance to the local community and encourages them to become involved in these programs. In coordination with MCCDEAP, we are developing a program for latchkey children (children in self-care) which will focus on both civilian and military children in and around Marine Corps bases and installations. The purpose is to provide professional guidance and keep children occupied with a developmentally appropriate curriculum which will reduce the demand for illegal drugs.

(4) The State of Maryland requested assistance in establishing a youth correctional program. The Department of Public Safety and Correctional Services requested assistance in preparing "drill instructors" for the initial phase. The request was approved by SECNAV and the Marine Corps Officer Candidate School commenced a 3 week orientation course for the 7 identified instructors on 29 Jan 90. The orientation course included organization, discipline, procedures, conduct of drill and physical training, instruction and practice on conducting inspections and establishing standards for clothing, personnel, and billeting areas, etc.; instruction on stress and harassment; and other applicable instruction and training. Assistance will be provided after this initial training of trainers to help the Department establish their own "train the trainers" course. Five of the original 7 Maryland Corrections Officers completed the training course and graduated on 21 Feb 90.

(5) In response to a request from the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department, the Marine Corps Recruit Depot, San Diego Drill Instructor's School is conducting two one-week periods of instruction at the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department Pitchess Honor Rancho. The focus of this instruction is on teaching drill and ceremonies, team and individual motivation, leadership and self-discipline. The training will prepare Sheriff's deputies in providing rehabilitation-oriented training to youthful offenders in Los Angeles County. The first training period is being conducted 25-29 Jun 90 and the second training period will be conducted 10-14 Sept 90.

(6) Currently the Marine Corps staffs 80 MCJROTC units at high schools throughout the Nation. We are currently pursuing the establishment of an additional 23 units for a total of 103. It is planned to put these additional units at high schools in inner cities, such as Washington, DC. The benefits provided by establishing positive role models in these schools could have a deterrent effect on the use of drugs by our high school students.

(7) On 3 Jan 90, Mr. Sterling Tucker, Director, Drug Control Policy for the District of Columbia, visited the Commandant to solicit Marine Corps support for the District's "NOT ON MY BLOCK" program. The program is designed to recapture the District's neighborhoods from the drug dealers. In order to accomplish this goal, the program will rely heavily on citizen volunteers, as well as religious, civic, and business groups participation. Some aspects of the program include neighborhood watch and cleanup activities, youth education and recreation activities, public relations campaign, and additional police assistance to eliminate the drug dealers. Mr. Tucker requested that the Marine Corps review the program and provide planning assistance to his

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strategy teams for program implementation. The Marine Corps agreed to review the program and has provided planning assistance as necessary.

3. The Marine Corps has set the pace in the Department of Defense in the counternarcotics effort and continues to be aggressive in assisting the President in reaching his goal of a drug-free America. The Commandant has recognized that this is a goal which we must attain, and is insisting that Marines of all ranks and in all positions in the chain of command get involved in the counternarcotics effort.

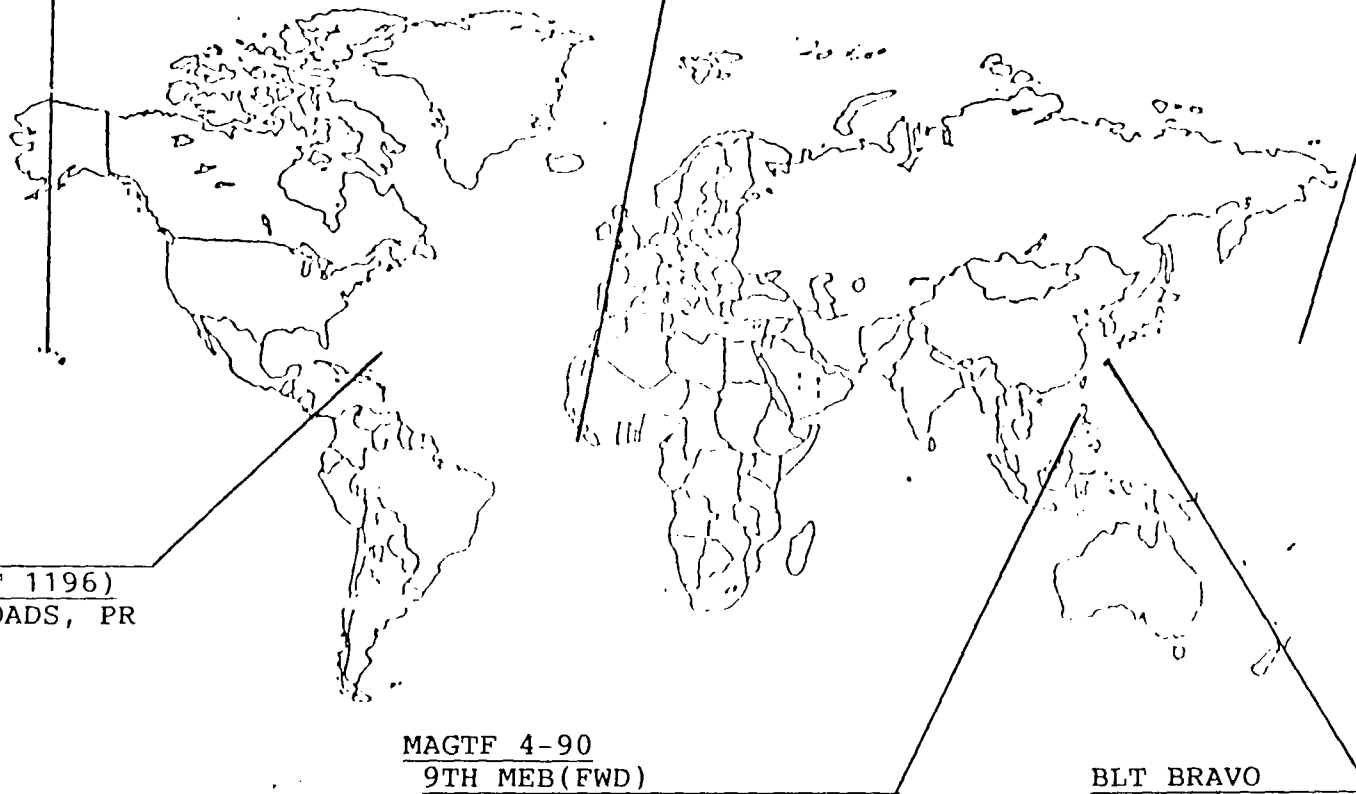

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INFORMATION PAPER

Subj: MARINE CORPS COUNTERNARCOTICS UPDATE

1. Background. The Assistant Commandant created a Counter-Drug Working Group (CDWG) in March of 1989 to prepare a "think piece" on the future role of the Marine Corps in support of the then unpublished National Drug Strategy. The current and contemplated future counternarcotics initiatives outlined in this paper represent initiatives addressed in the "think piece." In August, a comprehensive counternarcotics update or "newsletter" was sent to all major USMC field commands, bases and stations. The intent was to focus our commanders' efforts on the war on drugs, bring them on line with regard to current information, and advise them what initiatives the Marine Corps is pursuing.

2. Current Marine Corps Initiatives

a. Law Enforcement Agency (LEA) Support

(1) The Marine Corps provides personnel and training support to the LEA's. Currently there are four Marine Officers and two Staff Noncommissioned Officers assigned to the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA). Additionally, the Marine Corps temporarily provided two officers to assist the DEA in the development of a campaign plan for Operation Snowcap (drug lab eradication operations) and validated the training program for SNOWCAP. The Marine Corps is currently providing a plans officer and an intelligence officer, on a temporary basis, to assist SNOWCAP in analyzing the scope of chemical diversion in South America and formulating a chemical interdiction/control campaign plan.

(2) The Marine Corps provides pre-deployment training for DEA agents at MCCDC, Quantico, VA. This training prepares them for their deployments to South America in support of Operation SNOWCAP. This training is conducted on a quarterly basis.

b. Unified and Specified Commands' Counternarcotics Support. The Marine Corps provides officer and enlisted personnel to fill its share of the 237 DoD counternarcotics billets in the Unified and Specified Commands.

(1) CINCLANT (JTF-4)

(a) Aircraft Support. USMC aircraft (OV-10) support JTF-4 in their detection and monitoring missions in the Caribbean, the Gulf of Mexico, and areas off the coast of Florida. An OV-10 detachment from Second Marine Aircraft Wing has been continuously deployed to NAS, Roosevelt Roads, Puerto Rico since 1 Jan 90.

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(b) Caribbean Radar Support

1. Fourth Marine Aircraft Wing provided detection and monitoring support at Georgetown on Great Exuma Island during 1st Qtr FY-90. The TPS-59 radar filled a gap until an aerostat was in place.

2. Second Marine Aircraft Wing provides detection and monitoring support to JTF-4 from the Turks and Caicos Islands in the Bahamas. Using a TPS-8 Air Force radar, these Marines have contributed to numerous U.S. Customs Service intercepts of drug-trafficking aircraft.

(c) MTT Support. A mobile training team was sent to the Bahamas to provide the Royal Bahamas Defense Force with tactical training to enhance their drug interdiction capabilities. A second Bahamian MTT deployed 14 Jun 90 for a period of 30 days.

(2) CINCSO

(a) Military Support to Colombia

1. Upon receipt of the JCS Execute Order, CMC issued an Execute Order to direct and coordinate USMC support to Colombia under section 506(A) of the Foreign Assistance Act.

2. In addition to providing equipment support, the Force Commanders were tasked to be prepared to provide Mobile Training Teams (MTTs) to support equipment integration. The Marine Corps has sent survey teams to Colombia in preparation for the deployment of MTT's for riverine operations, recruit training, and ordnance repair. The ordnance repair MTT was completed on 30 May 90 and the recruit training MTT was completed 1 Jun 90. The riverine operations MTT is currently being conducted and is tentatively scheduled to conclude on 10 Aug 90. These MTTs provided training for Colombian Marines and additional MTTs for riverine operations are contemplated for Peru and Bolivia.

(b) Riverine Doctrine. In anticipation of MTT requirements for riverine operations in LATAM, CG MCCDC is refining current riverine doctrine, and has developed an initial concept for employment of Marine units in riverine operations. CG I MEF has developed the capability to deploy language trained MTTs for riverine training in support of the counternarcotics effort in LATAM.

(c) Deployments for Training. In response to a request from USCINCSO, Co A, 8th Engineer Support Battalion assisted in the construction of a radar site on the north coast of Honduras. The radar site will perform a drug interdiction mission as one of several sites monitoring air and sea traffic in the Caribbean Basin Radar Network (CBRN). Work commenced 16 May 90 and is expected to be completed by the end of

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Jun 90.

(3) CINCFOR

(a) CINCFOR was assigned the mission of coordinating law enforcement agencies support on the southwest border in an effort to stem the flow of illicit narcotics into the United States. General Powell requested, and CMC agreed, that the Marine Corps should provide a Marine Liaison Officer to Forces Command at Ft. McPherson, GA to assist in their counternarcotics efforts. LtCol Tony Hilliard reported 17 November 1989.

(b) CINCFOR established JTF-6 at El Paso to carry out his mission. Additionally, he requested a Marine Colonel to be the Deputy Commander of JTF-6 and a Marine Lieutenant Colonel to be the J-3 Operations Officer. Colonel Tom Carter is on board as the Deputy Commander and LtCol Bill Wood is the Operations Officer. Seventeen additional Marines will be assigned to JTF-6 in the near future in accordance with the approved Joint Manpower Plan. Currently, Major Don Todaro from the SO/LIC Branch in MCCDC is TAD to JTF-6 to provide engineer support to the staff until a Marine Engineer Officer is permanently assigned later this summer. JTF-6 was activated for operations on 2 January 1990 and has assumed OPCON of all units deployed for training and surveillance operations along the border.

(c) Southwest Border Training. The joint training with the Border Patrol on the border now coordinated by JTF-6 was initiated by the Marine Corps in the El Paso, Tucson, Del Rio, and Laredo Border Patrol Sectors. The initial training was conducted by Marines of the I Marine Expeditionary Force (I MEF). The concept offers the unique opportunity to conduct small unit tactical training in scouting and patrolling, camouflage and concealment, land navigation/map reading, and the selection and manning of observations posts (OP's). The training has the side benefit of assisting the Border Patrol in observing and reporting smuggler activity in certain areas of the border.

1. A Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the Marine Corps and the Immigration and Naturalization Service/ Border Patrol was developed to cover the initial operations. This MOU outlined the parameters of the joint training and surveillance operations concept and was signed by the Commissioner of INS and the Commandant on 11 October 89. The MOU has been superseded by the activation of JTF-6 and is no longer required to provide support along the southwest border.

2. A draft joint training/operations order has been developed which documents the agreed upon structure and procedures for the concept. This document is reviewed and refined as the training progresses.

3. The first deployment of Marines to the border occurred in late November when a company (-) from 1st Reconnaissance Battalion teamed up with Border Patrol agents to occupy OPs in the Tucson and El Paso Sectors. The Marines

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were billeted/messed at Fort Bliss (El Paso) and Davis-Monthan AFB (Tucson). Marines did not engage in search, seizure, apprehension, or pursuit of observed drug smugglers during this training, but they did provide information to the Border Patrol which resulted in some arrests and the seizure of significant amounts of marijuana and cocaine. Fourth Marine Division (USMCR) Marines, augmented by I MEF Surveillance, Reconnaissance, and Intelligence Group (SRIG) elements to include remotely piloted vehicles (RPVs), conducted similar training in the Laredo and Del Rio Border Patrol Sectors from 29 Jan 90 to 2 Mar 90. Their efforts resulted in the arrest of three smugglers and the seizure of large amounts of marijuana. Currently, Marines from the Marine Corps Air-Ground Combat Center in 29 Palms, CA are assisting the San Bernardino County Sheriff's Department (SBCSD) and Customs Service in the Morongo Valley area. The Marines are providing ground surveillance assistance in the vicinity of desert air strips in the Morongo basin area suspected of being used by drug smugglers. Any suspicious activity is reported directly to the SPCSD and the Customs Service for appropriate action. This training will continue through 31 Aug 90.

4. Intelligence Support. Captain Bryan Lavender from I MEF was assigned TAD to the Tucson Border Patrol Sector (11-22 Sep 89) and the El Paso Border Patrol Sector (10-20 Oct 89). He was sent to offer intelligence planning assistance and to aid the Sector headquarters in the formal collection, production and dissemination of tactical intelligence. Previously, there was no formal process for the fusion of the information generated from the individual Border Patrol contacts. LtCol Tom Sullivan was sent TAD to the Tucson Sector 25 March-8 April in a follow-up visit. LtCol Sullivan assisted the Border Patrol with the implementation of Capt Lavender's recommendations. Additionally, FORSCOM has requested the temporary assignment of a Marine Intelligence Officer to deploy with the Tactical Analysis Team (TAT) to Mexico City. This team will provide the Country Team intelligence interface between the Mexican government, American Embassy, FORSCOM and JTF-6 for the sharing of counternarcotics intelligence information. The duration of this assignment is expected to be 179 days.

(4) CINCPAC

(a) Aircraft Support. USMC aircraft (OV-10) are provided in support of JTF-5 and the U.S. Customs Service in their detection and monitoring missions.

(b) Source Country Support. Since many of the source countries in the Pacific theater are not accessible to U.S. forces, the III MEF source country counternarcotics detection, monitoring and interdiction effort will focus on Thailand and the Philippines. MTT's will be provided to train the local military and law enforcement officials in counternarcotics missions to include riverine operations if required. Marine Corps support in marijuana eradication in Hawaii is also being considered.

(c) Naval ships and aircraft will be used to detect, monitor and interdict drug-trafficking aircraft and vessels on the high seas.

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c. Support to Office of National Drug Control Policy (ONDCP)

(1) One Marine Officer is assigned to the ONDCP staff as an Operations Analyst and a Marine Staff Noncommissioned Officer is assigned as an Intelligence Analyst.

(2) On 1 April 1990, DoD established Regional Logistic Support Centers at Miami, El Paso, Long Beach, and Buffalo. The Marine Corps has provided a lieutenant colonel to head the Buffalo regional office and one Marine Staff Noncommissioned Officer with a logistics background has been assigned to the Miami, El Paso, and Long Beach offices. These offices will provide assistance to LEAs in procuring DOD equipment and training to support their local counternarcotics efforts.

d. Expanding MAGTF Capabilities. SECDEF tasked CINCLANT to develop a plan for the deployment of a Caribbean Counternarcotics Task Force. CG FMFLANT has developed a MAGTF concept to support this Task Force, when activated.

e. DEA Training Facility. At the request of the Attorney General, the Marine Corps has identified 170 acres of land adjacent to the FBI Academy at MCCDC, Quantico, VA to expand the FBI Academy to accommodate DEA training. Negotiations are taking place to effect the transfer of the land and to build a training center.

f. Demand-side Reduction Initiatives. The Marine Corps' internal drug abuse program is well known and has been highly successful in reducing the abuse of drugs within our ranks, but now the Corps is reaching beyond "taking care of its own" and is working with community leaders to assist them in their efforts in ridding their neighborhoods of the scourge of illicit drugs.

(1) The Assistant Commandant has appointed the Assistant Deputy Chief of Staff for Manpower and Reserve Affairs, Reserve Affairs, to direct Marine Corps demand-side initiatives with a nation-wide focus which reaches beyond the Corps and into the community.

(2) In the last year, Marines have been involved in community oriented drug prevention programs which served over 600,000 civilians. These programs include Boy/Girl/Cub Scouts, Brownies, church groups, elementary and high schools, MCJROTC, and prisons, etc. Marine Corps Substance Abuse Counselors are very much involved in the local community and are frequently called upon to give lectures on substance abuse.

(3) In order to formalize the Marine Corps' demand-side program, a Marine Corps Order (5355.4) entitled "Marine Corps Community Drug Education and Assistance Program" (MCCDEAP) has been published. This order provides guidance to the field on ways in which the Marine Corps and the individual Marine can be of

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assistance to the local community and encourages them to become involved in these programs. In coordination with MCCDEAP, we are developing a program for latchkey children (children in self-care) which will focus on both civilian and military children in and around Marine Corps bases and installations. The purpose is to provide professional guidance and keep children occupied with a developmentally appropriate curriculum which will reduce the demand for illegal drugs.

(4) The State of Maryland requested assistance in establishing a youth correctional program. The Department of Public Safety and Correctional Services requested assistance in preparing "drill instructors" for the initial phase. The request was approved by SECNAV and the Marine Corps Officer Candidate School commenced a 3 week orientation course for the 7 identified instructors on 29 Jan 90. The orientation course included organization, discipline, procedures, conduct of drill and physical training, instruction and practice on conducting inspections and establishing standards for clothing, personnel, and billeting areas, etc.; instruction on stress and harassment; and other applicable instruction and training. Assistance will be provided after this initial training of trainers to help the Department establish their own "train the trainers" course. Five of the original 7 Maryland Corrections Officers completed the training course and graduated on 21 Feb 90.

(5) In response to a request from the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department, the Marine Corps Recruit Depot, San Diego Drill Instructor's School is conducting two one-week periods of instruction at the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department Pitchess Honor Rancho. The focus of this instruction is on teaching drill and ceremonies, team and individual motivation, leadership and self-discipline. The training will prepare Sheriff's deputies in providing rehabilitation-oriented training to youthful offenders in Los Angeles County. The first training period is being conducted 25-29 Jun 90 and the second training period will be conducted 10-14 Sept 90.

(6) Currently the Marine Corps staffs 80 MCJROTC units at high schools throughout the Nation. We are currently pursuing the establishment of an additional 23 units for a total of 103. It is planned to put these additional units at high schools in inner cities, such as Washington, DC. The benefits provided by establishing positive role models in these schools could have a deterrent effect on the use of drugs by our high school students.

(7) On 3 Jan 90, Mr. Sterling Tucker, Director, Drug Control Policy for the District of Columbia, visited the Commandant to solicit Marine Corps support for the District's "NOT ON MY BLOCK" program. The program is designed to recapture the District's neighborhoods from the drug dealers. In order to accomplish this goal, the program will rely heavily on citizen volunteers, as well as religious, civic, and business groups participation. Some aspects of the program include neighborhood watch and cleanup activities, youth education and recreation activities, public relations campaign, and additional police assistance to eliminate the drug dealers. Mr. Tucker requested that the Marine Corps review the program and provide planning assistance to his

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strategy teams for program implementation. The Marine Corps agreed to review the program and has provided planning assistance as necessary.

3. The Marine Corps has set the pace in the Department of Defense in the counternarcotics effort and continues to be aggressive in assisting the President in reaching his goal of a drug-free America. The Commandant has recognized that this is a goal which we must attain, and is insisting that Marines of all ranks and in all positions in the chain of command get involved in the counternarcotics effort.

INFORMATION PAPER

Subj: MARINE CORPS COUNTERNARCOTICS UPDATE

1. Background. The Assistant Commandant created a Counter-Drug Working Group (CDWG) in March of 1989 to prepare a "think piece" on the future role of the Marine Corps in support of the then unpublished National Drug Strategy. The current and contemplated future counternarcotics initiatives outlined in this paper represent initiatives addressed in the "think piece." In August, a comprehensive counternarcotics update or "newsletter" was sent to all major USMC field commands, bases and stations. The intent was to focus our commanders' efforts on the war on drugs, bring them on line with regard to current information, and advise them what initiatives the Marine Corps is pursuing.

2. Current Marine Corps Initiatives

a. Law Enforcement Agency (LEA) Support

(1) The Marine Corps provides personnel and training support to the LEA's. Currently there are four Marine Officers and two Staff Noncommissioned Officers assigned to the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA). Additionally, the Marine Corps has temporarily provided two officers to assist the DEA in the development of a campaign plan for Operation Snowcap (drug lab eradication operations) and validated the training program for SNOWCAP.

(2) The Marine Corps currently provides pre-deployment training for DEA agents at MCCDC, Quantico, VA. This training prepares them for their deployments to South America in support of Operation SNOWCAP. This training is conducted on a quarterly basis.

b. Unified and Specified Commands' Counternarcotics Support. The Marine Corps provides officer and enlisted personnel to fill its share of the 237 DoD counternarcotics billets in the Unified and Specified Commands.

(1) CINCLANT (JTF-4)

(a) Aircraft Support. USMC aircraft (OV-10) support JTF-4 in their detection and monitoring missions in the Caribbean, the Gulf of Mexico, and areas off the coast of Florida.

(b) Caribbean Radar Support

1. Fourth Marine Aircraft Wing provided detection and monitoring support at Georgetown on Great Exuma Island during 1st Qtr FY-90. The TPS-59 radar

filled a gap until an aerostat was in place.

2. Second Marine Aircraft Wing provides detection and monitoring support to JTF-4 from the Turks and Caicos Islands in the Bahamas. Using a TPS-8 Air Force radar, these Marines have contributed to numerous U.S. Customs Service intercepts of drug-trafficking aircraft.

(c) MTT Support. A mobile training team was sent to the Bahamas to provide the Royal Bahamas Defense Force with tactical training to enhance their drug interdiction capabilities. A second Bahamian MTT is scheduled for Jun 90.

(2) CINCSO

(a) Military Support to Colombia

1. Upon receipt of the JCS Execute Order, CMC issued an Execute Order to direct and coordinate USMC support to Colombia under section 506(A) of the Foreign Assistance Act.

2. In addition to providing equipment support, the Force Commanders were tasked to be prepared to provide Mobile Training Teams (MTTs) to support equipment integration. The Marine Corps has sent survey teams to Colombia in preparation for the deployment of MTT's for riverine operations, recruit training, and ordnance repair. These MTTs are currently being conducted in Colombia to train the Colombian Marines and additional MTTs for riverine operations are being planned for Peru and Bolivia.

(b) Riverine Doctrine. In anticipation of MTT requirements for riverine operations in LATAM, CG MCCDC is refining current riverine doctrine, and has developed an initial concept for employment of Marine units in riverine operations. CG I MEF has developed the capability to deploy language trained MTTs for riverine training in support of the counternarcotics effort in LATAM.

(3) CINCFOR

(a) CINCFOR was assigned the mission of coordinating law enforcement agencies support on the southwest border in an effort to stem the flow of illicit narcotics into the United States. General Powell requested, and CMC agreed, that the Marine Corps should provide a Marine Liaison Officer to Forces Command at Ft. McPherson, GA to assist in their counternarcotics efforts. LtCol Tony Hilliard reported 17 November 1989.

(b) CINCFOR established JTF-6 at El Paso to carry out his mission. Additionally, he requested a Marine Colonel to be the Deputy Commander of JTF-6 and a Marine Lieutenant Colonel to be the J-3 Operations Officer. Colonel Tom Carter

is on board as the Deputy Commander and LtCol Bill Wood is the Operations Officer. Seventeen additional Marines will be assigned to JTF-6 in the near future in accordance with the approved Joint Manpower Plan. Currently, Major Don Todaro from the SO/LIC Branch in MCCDC is TAD to JTF-6 to provide major engineer support to the staff until a Marine Engineer Officer is permanently assigned later this summer. JTF-6 was activated for operations on 2 January 1990 and has assumed OPCON of all units deployed for training and surveillance operations along the border.

(c) Southwest Border Training. The joint training with the Border Patrol on the border now coordinated by JTF-6 was initiated by the Marine Corps in the El Paso, Tucson, Del Rio, and Laredo Border Patrol Sectors. The initial training was conducted by Marines of the I Marine Expeditionary Force (I MEF). The concept offers the unique opportunity to conduct small unit tactical training in scouting and patrolling, camouflage and concealment, land navigation/map reading, and the selection and manning of observations posts (OP's). The training has the side benefit of assisting the Border Patrol in observing and reporting smuggler activity in certain areas of the border.

1. A Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the Marine Corps and the Immigration and Naturalization Service/ Border Patrol was developed to cover the initial operations. This MOU outlined the parameters of the joint training and surveillance operations concept and was signed by the Commissioner of INS and the Commandant on 11 October 89. The MOU has been superseded by the activation of JTF-6 and is no longer required to provide support along the southwest border.

2. A draft joint training/operations order has been developed which documents the agreed upon structure and procedures for the concept. This document is reviewed and refined as the training progresses.

3. The first deployment of Marines to the border occurred in late November when a company (-) from 1st Reconnaissance Battalion teamed up with Border Patrol agents to occupy OPs in the Tucson and El Paso Sectors. The Marines were billeted/messed at Fort Bliss (El Paso) and Davis-Monthan AFB (Tucson). Marines did not engage in search, seizure, apprehension, or pursuit of observed drug smugglers during this training, but they did provide information to the Border Patrol which resulted in some arrests and the seizure of significant amounts of marijuana and cocaine. Fourth Marine Division (USMCR) Marines, augmented by I MEF Surveillance, Reconnaissance, and Intelligence Group (SRIG) elements to include remotely piloted vehicles (RPVs), conducted similar training in the Laredo and Del Rio Border Patrol Sectors from 29 Jan 90 to 2 Mar 90. Their efforts resulted in the arrest of three smugglers and the seizure of large amounts of marijuana. Currently, Marines from the Marine Corps Air-Ground Combat Center in 29 Palms, CA are assisting the San Bernardino County Sheriff's Department (SBCSD) and Customs Service in the Morongo Valley area. The Marines are providing ground surveillance assistance in the vicinity of desert air strips in the Morongo basin area suspected of being used by drug smugglers. Any suspicious activity is reported directly to the SPCSD and the Customs

Service for appropriate action. This training will continue through 30 Jun 90.

4. Intelligence Support. Captain Bryan Lavender from I MEF was assigned TAD to the Tucson Border Patrol Sector (11-22 Sep 89) and the El Paso Border Patrol Sector (10-20 Oct 89). He was sent to offer intelligence planning assistance and to aid the Sector headquarters in the formal collection, production and dissemination of tactical intelligence. Previously, there was no formal process for the fusion of the information generated from the individual Border Patrol contacts. LtCol Tom Sullivan was sent TAD to the Tucson Sector 25 March-8 April in a follow-up visit. LtCol Sullivan assisted the Border Patrol with the implementation of Capt Lavender's recommendations. Additionally, FORSCOM has requested the temporary assignment of a Marine Intelligence Officer to deploy with the Tactical Analysis Team (TAT) to Mexico City. This team will provide the Country Team intelligence interface between the Mexican government, American Embassy, FORSCOM and JTF-6 for the sharing of counternarcotics intelligence information. The duration of this assignment is expected to be 179 days.

(4) CINCPAC

(a) Aircraft Support. USMC aircraft (OV-10) are provided in support of JTF-5 and the U.S. Customs Service in their detection and monitoring missions.

(b) Source Country Support. Since many of the source countries in the Pacific theater are not accessible to U.S. forces, the III MEF source country counternarcotics detection, monitoring and interdiction effort will focus on Thailand and the Philippines. MTT's will be provided to train the local military and law enforcement officials in counternarcotics missions to include riverine operations if required. Marine Corps support in marijuana eradication in Hawaii is also being considered.

(c) Naval ships and aircraft will be used to detect, monitor and interdict drug-trafficking aircraft and vessels on the high seas.

c. Support to Office of National Drug Control Policy (ONDCP)

(1) One Marine Officer is assigned to the ONDCP staff as an Operations Analyst and a Marine Staff Noncommissioned Officer is assigned as an Intelligence Analyst.

(2) On 1 April 1990, DoD established Regional Logistic Support Centers at Miami, El Paso, Long Beach, and Buffalo. The Marine Corps has provided a lieutenant colonel to head the Buffalo regional office and one Marine Staff Noncommissioned Officer with a logistics background has been assigned to the Miami, El Paso, and Long Beach offices. These offices will provide assistance to LEAs in procuring DOD equipment and training to support their local counternarcotics efforts.

d. Expanding MAGTF Capabilities. SECDEF tasked CINCLANT to develop a plan for the deployment of a Caribbean Counternarcotics Task Force. CG FMFLANT has developed a MAGTF concept to support this Task Force, when activated. The deployment of subject Task Force is presently on hold.

e. DEA Training Facility. At the request of the Attorney General, the Marine Corps has identified 170 acres of land adjacent to the FBI Academy at MCCDC, Quantico, VA to expand the FBI Academy to accommodate DEA training. Negotiations are taking place to effect the transfer of the land and to build a training center.

f. Demand-side Reduction Initiatives. The Marine Corps' internal drug abuse program is well known and has been highly successful in reducing the abuse of drugs within our ranks, but now the Corps is reaching beyond "taking care of its own" and is working with community leaders to assist them in their efforts in ridding their neighborhoods of the scourge of illicit drugs.

(1) The Assistant Commandant has appointed the Assistant Deputy Chief of Staff for Manpower and Reserve Affairs, Reserve Affairs, to direct Marine Corps demand-side initiatives with a nation-wide focus which reaches beyond the Corps and into the community.

(2) In the last year, Marines have been involved in community oriented drug prevention programs which served over 600,000 civilians. These programs include Boy/Girl/Cub Scouts, Brownies, church groups, elementary and high schools, MCJROTC, and prisons, etc. Marine Corps Substance Abuse Counselors are very much involved in the local community and are frequently called upon to give lectures on substance abuse.

(3) In order to formalize the Marine Corps' demand-side program, a Marine Corps Order (5355.4) entitled "Marine Corps Community Drug Education and Assistance Program" (MCCDEAP) has been published. This order provides guidance to the field on ways in which the Marine Corps and the individual Marine can be of assistance to the local community and encourages them to become involved in these programs. In coordination with MCCDEAP, we are developing a program for latchkey children (children in self-care) which will focus on both civilian and military children in and around Marine Corps bases and installations. The purpose is to provide professional guidance and keep children occupied with a developmentally appropriate curriculum which will reduce the demand for illegal drugs.

(4) The State of Maryland requested assistance in establishing a youth correctional program. The Department of Public Safety and Correctional Services requested assistance in preparing "drill instructors" for the initial phase. The request was approved by SECNAV and the Marine Corps Officer Candidate School commenced a 3 week orientation course for the 7 identified instructors on 29 Jan 90. The orientation course included organization, discipline, procedures, conduct of drill and

physical training, instruction and practice on conducting inspections and establishing standards for clothing, personnel, and billeting areas, etc.; instruction on stress and harassment; and other applicable instruction and training. Assistance will be provided after this initial training of trainers to help the Department establish their own "train the trainers" course. Five of the original 7 Maryland Corrections Officers completed the training course and graduated on 21 Feb 90.

(5) Currently the Marine Corps staffs 80 MCJROTC units at high schools throughout the Nation. We are currently pursuing the establishment of an additional 23 units for a total of 103. It is planned to put these additional units at high schools in inner cities, such as Washington, DC. The benefits provided by establishing positive role models in these schools could have a deterrent effect on the use of drugs by our high school students.

(6) On 3 Jan 90, Mr. Sterling Tucker, Director, Drug Control Policy for the District of Columbia, visited the Commandant to solicit Marine Corps support for the District's "NOT ON MY BLOCK" program. The program is designed to recapture the District's neighborhoods from the drug dealers. In order to accomplish this goal, the program will rely heavily on citizen volunteers, as well as religious, civic, and business groups participation. Some aspects of the program include neighborhood watch and cleanup activities, youth education and recreation activities, public relations campaign, and additional police assistance to eliminate the drug dealers. Mr. Tucker requested that the Marine Corps review the program and provide planning assistance to his strategy teams for program implementation. The Marine Corps agreed to review the program and has provided planning assistance as necessary.

3. The Marine Corps has set the pace in the Department of Defense in the counternarcotics effort and continues to be aggressive in assisting the President in reaching his goal of a drug-free America. The Commandant has recognized that this is a goal which we must attain, and is insisting that Marines of all ranks and in all positions in the chain of command get involved in the counternarcotics effort.

- Develop and validate an air/ground operations SOP for Joint Task Force operations;
- Provide U.S. liaison teams with secure communications capability to Thai headquarters elements;
- Plan and conduct link-up operations between joint/combined/conventional/unconventional forces;
- Develop and test a detailed medical support plan using U.S. and host nation assets;
- Conduct a first time deployment and employment of the USCINCPAC enhanced crisis management capabilities in the support of a Commander Joint Task Force headquarters.

INFORMATION PAPER

Subj: MARINE CORPS COUNTERNARCOTICS UPDATE

1. Background. The Assistant Commandant created a Counter-Drug Working Group (CDWG) in March of 1989 to prepare a "think piece" on the future role of the Marine Corps in support of the then unpublished National Drug Strategy. The current and contemplated future counternarcotics initiatives outlined in this paper represent initiatives addressed in the "think piece." In August, a comprehensive counternarcotics update or "newsletter" was sent to all major USMC field commands, bases and stations. The intent was to focus our commanders' efforts on the war on drugs, bring them on line with regard to current information, and advise them what initiatives the Marine Corps is pursuing.

2. Current Marine Corps Initiatives

a. Law Enforcement Agency (LEA) Support

(1) The Marine Corps provides personnel and training support to the LEA's. Currently there are four Marine Officers and two Staff Noncommissioned Officers assigned to the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA). Additionally, the Marine Corps has temporarily provided two officers to assist the DEA in the development of a campaign plan for Operation Snowcap (drug lab eradication operations) and validated the training program for SNOWCAP.

(2) The Marine Corps currently provides pre-deployment training for DEA agents at MCCDC, Quantico, VA. This training prepares them for their deployments to South America in support of Operation SNOWCAP. This training is conducted on a quarterly basis.

b. Unified and Specified Commands' Counternarcotics Support. The Marine Corps provides officer and enlisted personnel to fill its share of the 237 DoD counternarcotics billets in the Unified and Specified Commands.

(1) CINCLANT (JTF-4)

(a) Aircraft Support. USMC aircraft (OV-10) support JTF-4 in their detection and monitoring missions in the Caribbean, the Gulf of Mexico, and areas off the coast of Florida.

(b) Caribbean Radar Support

1. Fourth Marine Aircraft Wing provided detection and monitoring

support at Georgetown on Great Exuma Island during 1st Qtr FY-90. The TPS-59 radar filled a gap until an aerostat was in place.

2. Second Marine Aircraft Wing provides detection and monitoring support to JTF-4 from the Turks and Caicos Islands in the Bahamas. Using a TPS-8 Air Force radar, these Marines have contributed to numerous U.S. Customs Service intercepts of drug-trafficking aircraft.

(c) MTT Support. A mobile training team was sent to the Bahamas to provide the Royal Bahamas Defense Force with tactical training to enhance their drug interdiction capabilities. A second Bahamian MTT is scheduled for Jun 90. MTTs are planned for deployment to Colombia in the near future to train the Colombian Marines in riverine operations, ordnance repair, and recruit/NCO training techniques. Additional MTTs for riverine operations are being planned for Peru and Bolivia.

(2) CINCSO

(a) Military Support to Colombia

1. Upon receipt of the JCS Execute Order, CMC issued an Execute Order to direct and coordinate USMC support to Colombia under section 506(A) of the Foreign Assistance Act.

2. In addition to providing equipment support, the Force Commanders were tasked to be prepared to provide Mobile Training Teams (MTTs) to support equipment integration. The Marine Corps has sent survey teams to Colombia in preparation for the deployment of MTT's for riverine operations, recruit training, and ordnance repair. These MTTs are scheduled to deploy during 3d Qtr FY90.

(b) Riverine Doctrine. In anticipation of MTT requirements for riverine operations in LATAM, CG MCCDC is refining current riverine doctrine, and has developed an initial concept for employment of Marine units in riverine operations. CG I MEF has developed the capability to deploy language trained MTTs for riverine training in support of the counternarcotics effort in LATAM.

(3) CINCFOR

(a) CINCFOR was assigned the mission of coordinating law enforcement agencies support on the southwest border in an effort to stem the flow of illicit narcotics into the United States. General Powell requested, and CMC agreed, that the Marine Corps should provide a Marine Liaison Officer to Forces Command at Ft. McPherson, GA to assist in their counternarcotics efforts. LtCol Tony Hilliard reported 17 November 1989.

(b) CINCFOR established JTF-6 at El Paso to carry out his mission. Additionally, he requested a Marine Colonel to be the Deputy Commander of JTF-6 and a Marine Lieutenant Colonel to be the J-3 Operations Officer. Colonel Tom Carter is on board as the Deputy Commander and LtCol Bill Wood is the Operations Officer. Seventeen additional Marines will be assigned to JTF-6 in the near future in accordance with the approved Joint Manpower Plan. JTF-6 was activated for operations on 2 January 1990 and has assumed OPCON of all units deployed for training and surveillance operations along the border.

(c) Southwest Border Training. The joint training with the Border Patrol on the border now coordinated by JTF-6 was initiated by the Marine Corps in the El Paso, Tucson, Del Rio, and Laredo Border Patrol Sectors. The initial training was conducted by Marines of the I Marine Expeditionary Force (I MEF). The concept offers the unique opportunity to conduct small unit tactical training in scouting and patrolling, camouflage and concealment, land navigation/map reading, and the selection and manning of observations posts (OP's). The training has the side benefit of assisting the Border Patrol in observing and reporting smuggler activity in certain areas of the border.

1. A Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the Marine Corps and the Immigration and Naturalization Service/ Border Patrol was developed to cover the initial operations. This MOU outlined the parameters of the joint training and surveillance operations concept and was signed by the Commissioner of INS and the Commandant on 11 October 89. The MOU has been superseded by the activation of JTF-6 and is no longer required to provide support along the southwest border.

2. A draft joint training/operations order has been developed which documents the agreed upon structure and procedures for the concept. This document is reviewed and refined as the training progresses.

3. The first deployment of Marines to the border occurred in late November when a company (-) from 1st Reconnaissance Battalion teamed up with Border Patrol agents to occupy OPs in the Tucson and El Paso Sectors. The Marines were billeted/messed at Fort Bliss (El Paso) and Davis-Monthan AFB (Tucson). Marines did not engage in search, seizure, apprehension, or pursuit of observed drug smugglers during this training, but they did provide information to the Border Patrol which resulted in some arrests and the seizure of significant amounts of marijuana and cocaine. Fourth Marine Division (USMCR) Marines, augmented by I MEF Surveillance, Reconnaissance, and Intelligence Group (SRIG) elements to include remotely piloted vehicles (RPVs), conducted similar training in the Laredo and Del Rio Border Patrol Sectors from 29 Jan 90 to 2 Mar 90. Their efforts resulted in the arrest of three smugglers and the seizure of large amounts of marijuana. Currently, Marines from the Marine Corps Air-Ground Combat Center in 29 Palms, CA are assisting the San Bernardino County Sheriff's Department (SBCSD) and Customs Service in the Morongo Valley area. The Marines are providing ground surveillance assistance in the vicinity of desert air strips in the Morongo basin area suspected of being used by drug

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smugglers. Any suspicious activity is reported directly to the SPCSD and the Customs Service for appropriate action. This operation will conclude on 30 Apr 90.

4. Intelligence Support. Captain Bryan Lavender from I MEF was assigned TAD to the Tucson Border Patrol Sector (11-22 Sep 89) and the El Paso Border Patrol Sector (10-20 Oct 89). He was sent to offer intelligence planning assistance and to aid the Sector headquarters in the formal collection, production and dissemination of tactical intelligence. Previously, there was no formal process for the fusion of the information generated from the individual Border Patrol contacts. LtCol Tom Sullivan was sent TAD to the Tucson Sector 25 March-8 April in a follow-up visit. LtCol Sullivan assisted the Border Patrol with the implementation of Capt Lavender's recommendations.

(4) CINCPAC

(a) Aircraft Support. USMC aircraft (OV-10) are provided in support of JTF-5 and the U.S. Customs Service in their detection and monitoring missions.

(b) Source Country Support. Since many of the source countries in the Pacific theater are not accessible to U.S. forces, the III MEF source country counternarcotics detection, monitoring and interdiction effort will focus on Thailand and the Philippines. MTT's will be provided to train the local military and law enforcement officials in counternarcotics missions to include riverine operations if required. Marine Corps support in marijuana eradication in Hawaii is also being considered.

(c) Naval ships and aircraft will be used to detect, monitor and interdict drug-trafficking aircraft and vessels on the high seas.

c. Support to Office of National Drug Control Policy (ONDCP)

(1) One Marine Officer is assigned to the ONDCP staff as an Operations Analyst and a Marine Staff Noncommissioned Officer is assigned as an Intelligence Analyst.

(2) On 1 April 1990, DoD established Regional Logistic Support Centers at Miami, El Paso, Long Beach, and Buffalo. The Marine Corps has provided a lieutenant colonel to head the Buffalo regional office and one Marine Staff Noncommissioned Officer with a logistics background has been assigned to the Miami, El Paso, and Long Beach offices. These offices will provide assistance to LEAs in procuring DOD equipment and training to support their local counternarcotics efforts.

d. Expanding MAGTF Capabilities. SECDEF tasked CINCLANT to develop a plan for the deployment of a Caribbean Counternarcotics Task Force. CG FMFLANT has developed a MAGTF concept to support this Task Force, when activated. The deployment of subject Task Force is presently on hold.

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e. DEA Training Facility. At the request of the Attorney General, the Marine Corps has identified 170 acres of land adjacent to the FBI Academy at MCCDC, Quantico, VA to expand the FBI Academy to accommodate DEA training. Negotiations are taking place to effect the transfer of the land and to build a training center.

f. Demand-side Reduction Initiatives. The Marine Corps' internal drug abuse program is well known and has been highly successful in reducing the abuse of drugs within our ranks, but now the Corps is reaching beyond "taking care of its own" and is working with community leaders to assist them in their efforts in ridding their neighborhoods of the scourge of illicit drugs.

(1) The Assistant Commandant has appointed the Assistant Deputy Chief of Staff for Manpower and Reserve Affairs, Reserve Affairs, to direct Marine Corps demand-side initiatives with a nation-wide focus which reaches beyond the Corps and into the community.

(2) In the last year, Marines have been involved in community oriented drug prevention programs which served over 600,000 civilians. These programs include Boy/Girl/Cub Scouts, Brownies, church groups, elementary and high schools, MCJROTC, and prisons, etc. Marine Corps Substance Abuse Counselors are very much involved in the local community and are frequently called upon to give lectures on substance abuse.

(3) In order to formalize the Marine Corps' demand-side program, a Marine Corps Order (5355.4) entitled "Marine Corps Community Drug Education and Assistance Program" (MCCDEAP) has been published. This order provides guidance to the field on ways in which the Marine Corps and the individual Marine can be of assistance to the local community and encourages them to become involved in these programs.

In coordination with MCCDEAP, we are developing a program for latchkey children (children in self-care) which will focus on both civilian and military children in and around Marine Corps bases and installations. The purpose is to provide professional guidance and keep children occupied with a developmentally appropriate curriculum which will reduce the demand for illegal drugs.

(4) The State of Maryland requested assistance in establishing a youth correctional program. The Department of Public Safety and Correctional Services requested assistance in preparing "drill instructors" for the initial phase. The request was approved by SECNAV and the Marine Corps Officer Candidate School commenced a 3 week orientation course for the 7 identified instructors on 29 Jan 90. The orientation course included organization, discipline, procedures, conduct of drill and physical training, instruction and practice on conducting inspections and establishing standards for clothing, personnel, and billeting areas, etc.; instruction on stress and harassment; and other applicable instruction and training. Assistance will be provided

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after this initial training of trainers to help the Department establish their own "train the trainers" course. Five of the original 7 Maryland Corrections Officers completed the training course and graduated on 21 Feb 90.

(5) Currently the Marine Corps staffs 80 MCJROTC units at high schools throughout the Nation. We are currently pursuing the establishment of an additional 23 units for a total of 103. It is planned to put these additional units at high schools in inner cities, such as Washington, DC. The benefits provided by establishing positive role models in these schools could have a deterrent effect on the use of drugs by our high school students.

(6) On 3 Jan 90, Mr. Sterling Tucker, Director, Drug Control Policy for the District of Columbia, visited the Commandant to solicit Marine Corps support for the District's "NOT ON MY BLOCK" program. The program is designed to recapture the District's neighborhoods from the drug dealers. In order to accomplish this goal, the program will rely heavily on citizen volunteers, as well as religious, civic, and business groups participation. Some aspects of the program include neighborhood watch and cleanup activities, youth education and recreation activities, public relations campaign, and additional police assistance to eliminate the drug dealers. Mr. Tucker requested that the Marine Corps review the program and provide planning assistance to his strategy teams for program implementation. The Marine Corps agreed to review the program and has provided planning assistance as necessary.

3. The Marine Corps has set the pace in the Department of Defense in the counternarcotics effort and continues to be aggressive in assisting the President in reaching his goal of a drug-free America. The Commandant has recognized that this is a goal which we must attain, and is insisting that Marines of all ranks and in all positions in the chain of command get involved in the counternarcotics effort.

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
