Robert Crews was named by the Carnegie Corporation of New York as one of the 2009 Carnegie Scholars selected for influential ideas and enhancing public discourse about Islam. A Princeton PhD, he is the author of several books and articles on these topics, including "For Prophet and Tsar: Islam and Empire in Russia and Central Asia" (Harvard University Press, 2006) and co-editor, with Amin Tarzi, of "The Taliban and the Crisis of Modern Afghanistan" (Harvard University Press, 2008).
