Ambassador Ronald Neumann



This is the sixth lecture in a series being hosted by the Middle East Studies at Marine Corps University entitled “A Multidisciplinary Approach to AfPak Region and Its People”.

Now President of the American Academy of Diplomacy, Ronald E. Neumann served previously as a Deputy Assistant Secretary and three times as Ambassador; to Algeria (1994-1997), Bahrain (2001-2004) and finally to the Islamic Republic of Afghanistan from July 2005 to April 2007. Before Afghanistan, Ambassador Neumann, a career member of the Senior Foreign Service, served in Baghdad from February 2004 with the Coalition Provisional Authority and then as Embassy Baghdad's principal interlocutor with the Multinational Command. Ambassador Neumann served as an Army infantry officer in Vietnam and holds a Bronze Star, Army Commendation Medal and Combat Infantry Badge. In Baghdad, he was awarded the Army Outstanding Civilian Service Medal.
