Qamaruddin Jabarkheil



This is the fifth lecture in a series entitled “A Multidisciplinary Approach to AfPak Region and Its People” being hosted by the Middle East Studies at Marine Corps University.

Since 2007 Mr. Qamaruddin Jabarkheil has been a West South Asia cultural and geopolitical expert at the Marine Corps’ Center for Advanced Operational Culture Learning at MCB Quantico, as well as a contracted interpreter and language instructor, most notably for the U.S. Department of State Foreign Service Institute. From 1996-1999 he served as the elected Chairman of the Board of Directors for the Afghan NGOs Coordination Bureau, where he coordinated between Afghan NGOs, international NGOs, United Nations Agencies, Afghan authorities, the Pakistani Government, and international donors. He also represented Afghan NGOs as the Afghan member of the UN Afghanistan Task Force on issues related to the humanitarian assistance for Afghanistan. From 1991- 1999 Mr. Jabarkheil was the Director of the Afghan Development Agency, where he managed humanitarian assistance projects in the sectors of irrigation, agriculture, education, construction, road repair, and drug awareness.
