



Behavioral Health Services Family Support Programs

- Community Counseling Programs (CCP) are located at every USMC Installation to meet the needs of Marines, Sailors and their families by providing short term solution focused counseling:
 - All clinicians are licensed and credentialed professionals who offer personally tailored counseling to address stress before more serious conditions develop
 - Free Confidential Services, Individual Counseling, Couples Counseling, Family Counseling, Child and Teen Counseling, Marine Intercept Program, and Referrals
 - Relationships, Communication, Stress, Anger, Family Problems/Dynamics, Adjustment Issues, Self Esteem, Grief and Loss, Parenting Skills
- Substance Abuse Programs (SAP) provides assessment, intervention and treatment to Marines identified with needs related to the misuse of drugs and/or alcohol.
- Family Advocacy Programs (FAP) provides assessment, intervention and treatment to families who have experienced domestic abuse in addition to the following:
 - New Parent Support Program provides home visits, parenting classes and resources for expectant parents and families raising children from birth through five years.
 - Prevention Education provides classes, groups and briefings to Marines and their families on various topics including relationship education, stress management, anger management, and parenting



Semper Fit Offerings for Families

- Youth Sports
 - Many installations offer a selection of youth sports (teams and clinics)
- Parks, Picnics, and Playgrounds
 - There are pavilions that can be rented for birthdays and events
 - Take advantage of the free parks, playgrounds, and trails (hiking, fitness)

Operation Tobacco Free Marine Tobacco Cessation Program

- Developed to provide USMC with evidence-based tools to help tobacco users quit successfully
- The OTFM TCP consists of a curriculum, training initiative, and media campaign
- Implementation of the OTFM TCP is anticipated for January 2017
 - Curriculum
 - Founded on Centers for Disease Control and Prevention guidelines
 - > Developed specifically for USMC in collaboration with Florida State University
 - Curriculum topics include health consequences of tobacco, barriers to quitting, familiarization with tobacco cessation medications, creating a quit plan and accessing support resources
 - Training
 - Semper Fit Health Promotion staff serve as the primary Tobacco Cessation SME aboard Marine Corps installations with training as Tobacco Treatment Specialists and OTFM Course Facilitators
 - Incorporates a train-the-trainer model where the Installation Tobacco Cessation SME can train other OTFM curriculum facilitators
 - Marketing Campaign
 - > An OTFM print and social media marketing campaign has been developed
 - The campaign focuses on various scenarios affecting a Marine's daily life, such as physical fitness, leadership, finances, and relationships





Child and Youth Programs

- Provide high quality, accessible, and affordable programs and services for eligible families with children 6 weeks to 18 years of age
 - 70 facilities across 14 Marine Corps installations
 - MilitaryChildCare.com (MCC), request for care internet based system, offers eligible patrons a centralized access point for requesting child care services and program information
 - Off Base Child Care Fee Assistance is available to eligible Marines with assistance in paying for accredited child care in the local community
 - Community Based Respite Child Care for eligible Wounded, Ill and Injured Marines and Fallen Marine families
 - > Up to 16 hours per month/per child at no cost





School Liaison Program

- Installation School Liaisons provide information related to school options, community services and resources
 - Located at 17 installations (CONUS and OCONUS)
 - Inform of laws impacting military-connected students such as the Interstate Compact and Impact Aid
 - Educate upon the unique challenges impacting military-connected students such as the importance of integrating into a new school and developing resiliency skills






Exceptional Family Member Program

- EFMP supports assignment of Marines to both OCONUS and CONUS locations to ensure availability and accessibility of needed medical care and educational services for their family member with special needs.
- Improves the quality of life for enrolled Marines and family members through information and referral services and non-clinical case management services:
 - Support groups
 - Family-to family networking opportunities
 - Special education support
 - Education, training and outreach to Marines, families and commands
 - Family needs assessment and service plan development
 - Transition support for individuals with special needs and their families (Permanent Change of Station, retirement, new diagnosis, etc.)
