



**Brigadier General Douglas K. Clark, USMC**  
**Assistant Deputy Commandant,**

Brigadier General Clark was commissioned in 1991 and has had the privilege of command at every level. He served as a Weapons Platoon Commander and Executive Officer at 3d Battalion, 1st Marines, participating in Operation PEACEMAKER (Los Angeles Riots-1992); Unit Deployment Program (UDP) to Okinawa standing up the 31st MEU(SOC); WESTPAC deployment; and Operation UNITED SHIELD (Somalia-1995). He also served as a Platoon Commander in 4th Light Armored Reconnaissance (LAR) Battalion (1999-2000). He commanded Company C, 4th LAR (2001-2004) deploying in 2003 to Operation IRAQI FREEDOM with Task Force Tarawa. The unit redeployed to Okinawa, Japan on UDP assigned to Combat Assault Battalion, 3d Marine Division. At the battalion level, he commanded



3d Battalion, 25th Marine Regiment (2007-2009). Most recently, he was the Marine Detachment Commander in the Joint Enabling Capabilities Command, US Transportation Command (2017-2020).

Brigadier General Clark's staff assignments include the Amphibious Reconnaissance School, Expeditionary Warfare Training Group Atlantic (1995-98) serving as the Assistant Officer in Charge. He also taught Operations Other Than War and Maritime Prepositioning Force Staff Planning. He was the S-3 Training Officer at 4th Supply Battalion, 4th Force Service Support Group (1998-1999). He was the Peacetime Wartime Support Team Officer in Charge in 4th LAR (2000-2001). He was a planner and observer trainer at U.S. Joint Forces Command (2004-2005), the XO for 4th LAR Battalion (2005-2006), and a planner in G-3/5/7, Marine Forces Command (2006-2007). He served as the Pakistan Planner and Civilian-Military Planner for the ISAF commander in Kabul, Afghanistan (2009-2010) and then the Washington Liaison for US Central Command (2010-2012). He also served in Headquarters Marine Corps as: Lead Force Structure Planner for the QDR Integration Group (2012-2014); branch head in Programs & Resources (2014-2015); and Deputy Chief of Expeditionary Policy and Assistant Director of Operations in Plans, Policy, and Operations (2015-2017).

Brigadier General Clark is a graduate of Joint Advanced Warfighting School (Norfolk, VA-2009), Joint Forces Staff College (Norfolk, VA-2006), Canadian Militia Command and Staff College (Kingston, Ontario-2005), USMC Command and Staff DEP (2003), and Amphibious Warfare School DEP (2001). He also attended the Senior Strategic Communication Course (NATO School Oberammergau-2018) and Pearson Peacekeeping School (Nova Scotia, Canada-1997). He holds a bachelor's degree from Virginia Tech (1990) and master's degree from National Defense University (2009). He is married with two children.
